### **PREFACE**

Mr. Speaker Sir, The Constituencies Fund Committee is a Select Committee of Parliament constituted pursuant to Section 27 (1) of the Constituencies Development Fund (Amendment) Act, 2007.

Its mandate, according to section 27 (4), is;-

- (a) to determine the allocation and distribution to each constituency and the utilization of any unspent funds intended for use by the Board;
- (b) to consider and report to Parliament, with recommendations, names of persons required to be approved by Parliament under the Constituencies Development Fund Act;
- (c) to consider and recommend to Parliament any matter requiring action by the National Assembly pursuant to the provisions of the Constituencies Development Fund Act;
- (d) to oversee the implementation of the CDF Act and in this respect, shall after every two years submit a report to the National Assembly and where necessary, propose any amendments to this Act, in particular, with respect to the quantum of funds repayable into the Fund in accordance with section 4 of the Act.
- (e) to oversee the policy framework and legislative matters that may arise in relation to the Fund;
- (f) to continually review the framework set out for the efficient delivery of development programmes financed through the Fund; and

g) to carry out any other functions relevant to the work of the Fund.

Section 27 (4) (a) of the CDF (Amendment) Act, 2007 specifically tasks the Committee to determine the allocation and distribution to each constituency. It is for this reason that the Committee wishes to report to the House about its decision on allocation of Kshs. 14.

283 Billion, being the amount allocated by Ministry of Finance to CDF in the Financial Year 2010/11.

The Committee wishes to record its appreciation to the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Finance for continuously increasing allocation to CDF since the beginning of the Fund and especially in FY 2010/11 from Kshs. 12.33 billion to Kshs. 14.283 billion. Despite the failure by ministry to allocate a minimum of 2.5% of all ordinary government revenue to CDF in some of the past years, the committee does not take for granted the contribution made by the Ministry for Finance in the CDF operations. We also want to appreciate that the Hon Minister for Finance has improved the quarterly disbursements of the Fund as stipulated by law.

The Committee also wishes to thank the Minister for Planning, National Development and Vision 2030 for his role as the Minister in charge of planning and general development of this country and in whose docket CDF falls under. His availability to meet the committee as and when the Committee feels the need to meet him cannot go unappreciated.

Further, the Committee wishes to record its appreciation to the Liaison Committee and the Clerk of the National Assembly for the continuous facilitation of the Committee's operations. Our Clerk Assistants are equally appreciated.

Finally Mr. Speaker, I cannot conclude my report, without thanking Parliament for nominating extremely talented, knowledgeable, dedicated, energetic members to the Constituency Fund Committee. Indeed Mr. Speaker, without fear of contradiction, we have exceeded the 100<sup>th</sup> meeting without a single meeting that failed for lack of quorum.

This report is being made pursuant to the provisions of CDF Act, section 27 (3) and (5). Section 27 (3) requires that the procedures and rules for the operation of the Constituencies Fund shall be governed by the Standing Orders of the National Assembly.

Section 27 (5) states that the committee may make reports other than the statutory report in sub section 27 (4) (d) to appraise the National Assembly on various matters relating to the Fund, *inter alia*.

Therefore, According to Standing Order 181, it is my pleasure, privilege and honour, on behalf of the Constituencies Fund Committee, to table this report before the House for noting.

### 1. Background to the Constituencies Development Fund

The Constituency Development Fund was established through an Act of Parliament, the CDF Act, 2003. The Act came into operation in 2004 after it was gazetted in the Kenya Gazette Supplement No. 107 (Act No. 11) dated 9<sup>th</sup> January 2004. The CDF Act has been amended once, i.e in 2007. The implementation of CDF programme was started in 2003/04 financial year.

Section 4 (2) (a) of the CDF (Amendment)Act, 2007 provides that 2.5% of all ordinary Government revenue collected in every financial year is devoted to the constituencies for purposes of development and in particular the fight against poverty at the constituency level.

The purpose of the Act as stated in Section 3 of the CDF (Amendment) Act, 2007 ensures that a specific portion of the national annual budget is devoted to the constituencies for purposes of development and in particular in the fight against poverty at the constituency level.

### 2. Historical trend of CDF Allocations

The Minister for Finance is guided by the CDF (Amendment) Act, 2007 on how much to allocate to CDF every financial year, i.e., 2.5% of all Government revenue.

The following is a schedule of Treasury allocations to CDF since 2003 to date;

### 3. Allocation formula and Criteria

Allocation criteria is determined in Sections 9 (1) and 19(2) of the Act. Section 9(1) gives the Minister powers to allocate the funds to each constituency, with the concurrence of the Constituency Fund Committee. Section 19 (1) gives the formula that the minister should use while allocating the money. It stipulates that 75% of all funds allocated to the CDF, (i.e. 2.5% of all government revenue) is allocated equally amongst all 210

constituencies; the remaining 25% is divided by the national poverty index multiplied by the constituency poverty index.

Based on the above criteria, each year the Minister of Planning, National Development & Vision 2030 in concurrence with the Constituencies Fund Committee allocates funds to constituencies as provided for in Section 19 (1) of the Act. This has been the tradition since the Financial Year 2008/09.

As provided for in the Act, 75% of each year's allocation is allocated equally to all constituencies while 25% is calculated based on constituency poverty index figures. These figures are provided by the Kenya National Bureau of Statistics, which according to the Statistics Act, 2006 is the sole custodian of government statistics.

Since 2003, allocation of 25% based on poverty index has been done using the poverty index survey of 1999.

### 4. Allocation Process of Financial Year 2010/11Funds

The Committee invited the Minister for Planning, National Development and Vision 2030, Hon. Wycliffe Oparanya, EGH, MP to a meeting on 7<sup>th</sup> July, 2010 to discuss allocation of Kshs.14. 283 Billion, being the amount allocated by Ministry of Finance to CDF in the Financial Year 2010/11.

During the said meeting, it was resolved that the Ministry of Planning, National Development and Vision 2030 should come up with allocation of 2010/11 FY funds based on the most recent statistics of population and poverty as previously promised by the Minister. For purposes of comparison and future simulations of the proposed CDF Task Review formulation, the committee requested the minister to look at other scenarios.

The following scenarios were considered for internal consumption of the committee:

- i. Allocation based on 1997 poverty index survey and 1999 census published 2005
- ii. Allocation based on 2005/06 poverty index survey published 2007 and 2009 Population & Housing Census
- iii. Formula as proposed by the CDF Review Taskforce

The Minister presented the three scenarios to the committee during a retreat held in Mombasa by the CDF Board and the Committee from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> September, 2010.

During the retreat, the Committee was presented with the three scenarios and after lengthy discussions, the Committee unanimously adopted scenario 2 which was based on allocations using 2005/06 Kenya National Bureau of Statistics Poverty Index Survey of 2006 and the Results of the 2009 Population and Housing Census. The committee considered that scenario 1 was living in the past and would be considered discriminatory in the light of the new constitution. Scenario 3 could not also be entertained as it was futuristic. The Task Force Report, although ready, is yet to be formally released by the Minister.

Adoption of Scenario 2 was informed by the fact that 2006 Poverty Index was the latest and most comprehensive poverty index survey by government and was therefore the most representative of the situation on the ground as opposed to the 1999 poverty index survey. The committee took cognizance of the fact that poverty indices are not static and therefore the need to take into account changes in poverty levels as the situation changes.

### 5. Recommendations

The Committee would like to acknowledge that Treasury has already disbursed kshs. 2 billion to the CDF Board. The Committee resolved to have the CDF Board disburse up to Kshs. 2 million to each constituency for administration costs pending the tabling of the allocations by the Minister for Planning. This will enable constituencies pay their utility bills, salaries and any emergencies that may arise before the actual allocation figures are tabled by the Minister.

The Committee wrote to the Minister for Planning, National Development and Vision 2030 asking him to table CDF constituency allocations for FY 2010/11 as adopted by the Committee to enable various constituencies plan for projects to be implemented using 2010/11 FY funds.

The Minister tabled the allocations on Tuesday, 26<sup>th</sup> October, 2010 and the Committee would like to assure the House that funding of projects using FY 2010/11 funds will begin immediately without delay.

### MIN.NO. 512/2010 Meeting with Minister for Planning, National Development & Vision 2030.

Hon. Wycliffe Oparanya, Minister for Planning informed the committee that he was aware that Treasury had not remitted all the funds owed to CDF as per the 2.5% requirement stipulated in the Act. He said he has directed the Board CEO to go to Treasury to reconcile the figures with them. According to the Minister and the Board, the following are the arrears owed to CDF:-

The Minister said his ministry was following up with Treasury to ensure that the monies are remitted to CDF as per the law. The Committee vowed to take up the matter with the DPM & Minister for Finance to ensure that he adheres to the law.

On 2010/11 allocations to CDF, the Minister informed the Committee that he will use the formula provided in Section 19 of the Act to allocate funds to the constituencies.

Poverty Index came up as a contentious issue. The Ministry has been using 1999 Kenya National Bureau of Statistics figures to do the allocations. It was agreed that the Ministry should come up with 3 scenarios for allocation using the new Poverty Index for the committee to take a position on. The scenarios are:-

- i. Poverty Index using 1999 figures
- ii. Poverty Index using 2006 figures
- iii. Formula as proposed by the CDF Review Taskforce

The last Poverty Index survey was conducted in 2006. The survey is conducted every 5 years. The 2010/11 survey is yet to be conducted because Treasury is yet to remit funds for the exercise.

It was resolved that the Minister will present the committee with the 3 scenarios during a one-day retreat to be organised by the Ministry. This will enable the committee make an informed choice on the allocations to constituencies.

The Minister also informed the committee that; -

- a) Official census results will be released in late August 2010. He said the reason for the delay is that it is a very elaborate exercise that takes long to analyse. The raw figures will be ready by end of July 2010.
- b) CDF Taskforce Final Report will be presented to Parliament in two weeks time.

### MIN.NO. 513/2010 Meeting with Deputy Prime Minister & Minister for Finance

The committee took issue with the failure by the DPM & Minister for Finance to attend the meeting despite having been given ample notice for the meeting. The Permanent Secretary was not allowed to appear before the committee because the committee wanted to deal directly with the ministers and not his officers.

The committee vowed to use other available means to address the issue of the Minister's failure to attend the committee meetings.
