

Honourable Members, section 8 of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act provides that, unless otherwise provide in law, the Committee to which such nomination is referred shall consider the matter and table a report in the House within fourteen (14) days from the date of notification.

It is therefore imperative that the Committee immediately commences the process of the consideration of approval of the nominee to enable speedy conclusion within the set timelines. For the avoidance of doubt, the Committee should notify the nominee and the general public of the time and place of holding approval hearings by **7th March, 2019**; following which the approval hearings should commence. 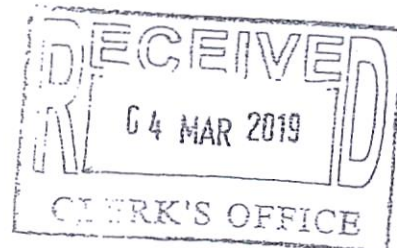

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

Lent is a period of prayer, fasting and charity

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the 40-day Lenten season, during which Christians seek a deeper union with the divine by doing good and avoiding evil. It is a pivotal day in the calendar of the Catholic Church, whose members gather in churches and shrines to participate in a liturgy that invites them to believe in the gospel and urges them to mend their ways.

The Ash Wednesday liturgy is one of the most solemn, popular and poignant for all Catholics. Attendance is often comparable to ordinary Sundays and major feast days, yet Ash Wednesday falls on a normal working day. Even in countries where Christianity has declined, a considerable number of faithful still participate in this liturgy.

Lent has precedents in the Old Testament and is firmly grounded on Jesus's fasting for 40 days and nights. It is inspired by his teaching on helping the needy, and the call to prayer and fasting without making a show of it (Matt 6: 1-18).

The Code of Canon Law guides Catholics on how and when to fast profitably. Canon 1251 says: "Abstinence from eating meat or another food according to the prescriptions of the Conference of Bishops is to be observed on Fridays throughout the year, unless they are solemnities; abstinence and fast are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday."



The ash mark is an indicator that the individual has the fundamental option of seeking greater union with God and will avoid corruption."

In Kenya, the norm for Catholics is not to eat meat on the Fridays during Lent, as determined by the Conference of Bishops (See Canon 1253).

The practice of abstaining from

certain pleasures is found in several religious traditions, including Hinduism, Islam and Judaism. African scholars Bolaji Idowu and John S. Mbiti have accounts of indigenous religious personages required to abstain from certain foods or acts, such as sexual intercourse, for a specified period before they perform key religious rites.

The Ash Wednesday liturgy is symbolic and replete with meaning. A symbol is a sign where an item or act stands in for, or represents, another. The act of marking with ash, with roots in Hebrew practice, is an indicator that the individual

that person, but others as well. So, a fruitful Lent benefits the individual and the community.

Some cultures have a curious take on Lent. They have an interesting argument: "Since we'll be fasting for 40 days, let's prepare for Lent by eating, drinking and having a good time." And, voila, they have Mardi Gras, literally Fat Tuesday, on the eve of Ash Wednesday, famous for its huge, nightlong carnivals with revelry and provocative dancing.

The story is told of a man who was accosted by brigands as he took an evening walk on Ash Wednesday. To defuse the situation, he offered the lead robber a cigarette, saying: "Let's talk." The brigand shot back: "No way. Away with your cigarettes. It's money I want. I don't smoke during Lent!"

Lent is a season during which the faithful deny themselves some material goods or pleasures in order to experience spiritual or holistic growth. There is a need for an honest correlation between the material things sacrificed and the spiritual good sought.

Dioceses in Kenya are now launching Lenten Campaigns whose objective is to support those in need using the proceeds saved through fasting. This is an opportune time to ask oneself: "What am I giving up? Why?"

Prof. George A. O. Magoha is the immediate former Vice-Chancellor, University of Nairobi (UoN), since January 2005 to January 2015 and a Professor of Surgery and a Consultant Urologist, College of Health Sciences, UoN. He is the current President of the Association of Medical Councils of Africa (AMCOA) from August 2013 and will serve in this capacity for a period of 2 years. He is also the Chairman of the Kenya Medical Practitioners and Dentists Board (KMPDB) from 2009 to date and has been a member of the board from 1999. He has been Chairman of Kenya Association of Urological Surgeons (KAUS) from the year 1997 to 2013 and also the immediate former President of the Association of African Universities (AAU) where he served from 2011 to 2013. He has been a member of the AAU executive board from 2005 to date. Prof. Magoha has also been a commissioner in the Commission for Higher Education (CHE), currently, the Commission for University Education (CUE) from 2005 to 2013.

Born in 1952, Prof. Magoha undertook his primary education in Yala and Nairobi before joining Starehe Boys Centre and Strathmore College for his High School education in Kenya. He then proceeded to the University of Lagos in Nigeria where he studied Medicine. He furthered his studies in Surgery and Urology at Lagos University Teaching Hospital, University College Hospital, Ibadan, Royal College of Surgeons, Dublin, Ireland and Royal Postgraduate Medical School Hammersmith Hospital, London, Department of Urology, where he earned various academic awards. He trained in executive management at the Stanford University, Graduate School of Business, and has many international professional honours and awards. Locally, the awards include Moran of the Burning Spear (MBS) and Elder of the Burning Spear (EBS).

Prof. Magoha established his career in Surgery at the Lagos University Teaching Hospital as an intern and rose to the position of Senior Resident and Clinical Lecturer in Surgery. He also served as a Lecturer in the same hospital and a Consultant Surgeon in various leading hospitals in Lagos, Nigeria. Prof. Magoha joined the University of Nairobi as a Lecturer in Urological Surgery in 1988 and rose through the ranks to become a full Professor of Surgery in 2000. He has served in various administrative positions at the University rising from Chairman of the Academic Department of Surgery in 1999, Dean of the School of Medicine, Principal of the College of Health Sciences, Deputy Vice-Chancellor in charge of Administration and Finance to Vice-Chancellor in January 2005. NATIONAL, CONTINENTAL AND PROFESSIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES FROM 1999 TO DATE

1. MEMBER OF THE MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS AND DENTISTS BOARD FROM 1999 TO DATE

I was elected a member of the Medical Practitioners and Dentists Board in 1999 and subsequently elected Chairman of the Boards Private Practice Committee charged with the regulation of medical practice in Kenya. In this capacity, I have inspected most of the Government and Private Medical institutions countrywide over the past five years. I am also a member of the Finance Committee of the Board.

2. CHAIRMAN MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS AND DENTISTS BOARD OF KENYA FROM 2009 TO DATE

I was appointed Chairman of the Medical Practitioners and Dentists Board of Kenya in November 2009 and re-appointed in 2014 for another five year term. As Chairman, I have steered the board to oversee the construction of the current four storey office block at a cost of three hundred million Kenya shillings saved internally as a result of prudent financial management. The office block which is already occupied is set to be officially open on the 6th of April 2015

As Chairman of the board, I have also led the Kenyan delegation to inspect together with delegates from other partner States, all Universities (both private and public) within the East African Community States that are responsible for the training of medical doctors. We have already inspected seven Universities in the republic of Uganda, and eight Universities in Kenya. We are scheduled to inspect eight Universities in Tanzania later this month (March 2016) before proceeding to Rwanda and Burundi.

3. PRESIDENT ASSOCIATION OF MEDICAL COUNCILS OF AFRICA
(AMCOA)

I was elected the president of the Association of Medical Councils of Africa (AMCOA) in Kigali in the republic of Rwanda in 2013, and re-elected in Mombasa Kenya in 2015 for another term of two years. As president of AMCOA, I am responsible for the regulation of medical and health practice on the whole continent of Africa.

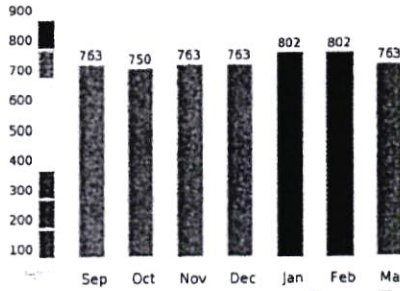

An Act of the Parliament to provide for procedures for parliamentary approval of constitutional and statutory appointments and for connected purposes

[Act No. 33 of 2011, Act No. 18 of 2014, Sch.]

1. Short title

This Act may be cited as the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act.

2. Interpretation

In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires—

“**appointing authority**” means any person who, under the Constitution or any other law, is required to make an appointment for which the approval of Parliament is required;

“**appointment**” includes any re-appointment to the same body, whether or not in the same capacity;

“**candidate**” means a person who has been proposed or nominated for appointment to a public office;

“**Clerk**” means the Clerk of the relevant House of Parliament; and

“**Committee**” means the relevant committee of Parliament or such other Committee as the Speaker may, for good reasons, direct.

3. Exercise of powers of appointment

An appointment under the Constitution or any other law for which the approval of Parliament is required shall not be made unless the appointment is approved or deemed to have been approved by Parliament in accordance with this Act.

4. Notification of vetting requirements

Any advertisement inviting applications for nomination for appointment to an office to which this Act applies shall indicate that candidates so nominated shall be required to appear before a committee of Parliament for vetting.

5. Notification of nomination

(1) An appointing authority shall, upon nominating a person for an appointment to which this Act applies, notify the relevant House of Parliament accordingly.

(2) A notification under subsection (1) shall be—

- (a) in writing;
- (b) be lodged with the Clerk of the relevant House of Parliament.

(3) A notification of appointment shall be accompanied by information concerning the nominee, having regard to the issues mentioned in section 7.

(4) For purposes of this Act, a notification of nomination shall be deemed to be duly given on the day on which it complies fully with subsections (2) and (3).

6. Approval hearing

(1) Upon receipt of a notification of appointment, the Clerk shall invite the Committee to hold an approval hearing.

(2) The Committee shall determine the time and place for the holding of the approval hearing and shall inform the Clerk.

(3) The Clerk shall notify a candidate of the time and place for the holding of an approval hearing.

(4) The Committee shall notify the public of the time and place for holding an approval hearing at least seven days prior to the hearing.

(5) Subject to this Act, all Committee proceedings on public appointments shall be open and transparent.

(6) Despite subsection (5), a Committee may, on its own motion or on the application of a candidate or any other concerned person, determine that the whole or part of its sittings shall be held in camera.

(7) An approval hearing shall focus on a candidate's academic credentials, professional training and experience, personal integrity and background.

(8) The criteria specified in the Schedule shall be used by a Committee during an approval hearing for the purposes of vetting a candidate.

(9) Any person may, prior to the approval hearing, and by written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated.

(10) A candidate may, at any time, by notice in writing addressed to the Clerk, withdraw from the approval process and the candidate's nomination shall thereupon lapse.

7. Issues for consideration

The issues for consideration by the relevant House of Parliament in relation to any nomination shall be—

- (a) the procedure used to arrive at the nominee;
- (b) any constitutional or statutory requirements relating to the office in question; and
- (c) the suitability of the nominee for the appointment proposed having regard to whether the nominee's abilities, experience and qualities meet the needs of the body to which nomination is being made.

8. Period for consideration and report

(1) Unless otherwise provided in any law, a Committee shall consider a nomination and table its report in the relevant House for debate and decision within fourteen days from the date on which the notification of nomination was given in accordance with section 5.

(2) At the conclusion of an approval hearing, the Committee shall prepare its report on the suitability of the candidate to be appointed to the office to which the candidate has been nominated, and shall include in the report, such recommendations as the Committee may consider necessary.

9. Failure of Parliament to act on nomination

If, after expiry of the period for consideration specified in section 8, Parliament has neither approved nor rejected a nomination of a candidate, the candidate shall be deemed to have been approved.

10. Rejection of nomination

Where the nomination of a candidate is rejected by Parliament, the appointing authority may submit to the relevant House the name of another candidate, and the procedure for approval specified in this Act shall apply accordingly.

11. Notification of decision

The Clerk shall notify the appointing authority of the decision of the relevant House of Parliament within seven days of the decision.

12. Powers of the committee

(1) The committee shall have power to summon any person to appear before it for the purpose of giving evidence or providing information during approval hearing.

(2) For purposes of subsection (1), the committee shall have the same powers as the High Court to—

- (a) enforce the attendance of witnesses and examine them on oath, affirmation or otherwise;
- (b) compel the production of documents; and
- (c) issue a commission or request to examine witnesses abroad.

(3) Any person who—

- (a) disobeys any order made by a committee for attendance or for production of papers, books, documents or records; or
- (b) refuses to be examined before, or to answer any lawful and relevant question put by, a committee,

commits an offence and shall be liable, on conviction, to a fine not exceeding two hundred thousand shillings or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year, or to both.

13. Extension of time.

(1) Despite the provision of this Act or any other written law, where a time is prescribed for doing an act or taking a proceeding by the National Assembly relating to a public appointment, the National Assembly may, by resolution, extend that time by a period not exceeding fourteen days.

(2) Where an extension of time is granted under subsection (1), the doing of all other acts consequential thereto shall be deemed to have been extended accordingly.

(3) The power of the National Assembly contemplated under subsection (1), may be exercised —

- (a) only once in a session of the National Assembly in respect of a particular matter; and
- (b) only in exceptional circumstances to be certified by the Speaker.

CRITERIA FOR VETTING/APPROVAL OF NOMINEES FOR
APPOINTMENT TO PUBLIC OFFICE BY PARLIAMENT QUESTIONNAIRE

Notes:

- (a) This questionnaire applies to appointments to public office arising by or under the Constitution or any other law where parliamentary approval is required.
- (b) The questionnaire shall be used by the relevant parliamentary committee to vet a nominee appearing before the committee in the process of parliamentary approval.
- (c) The questionnaire shall be filled and submitted by the nominee to the relevant parliamentary committee through the Clerk of the relevant House of Parliament on or before a date set by the committee.
- (d) The submission of false information in the questionnaire is an offence and may result in prosecution.
- (e) Any form of canvassing by a nominee shall lead to disqualification.
- (f) The nominee must answer all the questions.

- List chronologically any public offices you have held or are currently holding, including the terms of service and whether such positions were elected or appointed.
 - List all memberships and offices held in and services rendered, whether compensated or not, to any political party or election committee, if you have ever held a position or played a role in a political campaign, identify the particulars of the campaign, including the candidate, dates of the campaign, your title and responsibilities. Also include any linkage you have to a political party at present.
 - Have you ever been dismissed or otherwise removed from office for a contravention of the provisions of Article 75 of the Constitution?
 - Have you ever been adversely associated with practices that depict bias, favouritism or nepotism in the discharge of public duties?
21. Deferred Income/Future Benefits: (List the sources, amounts and dates of all anticipated receipts from deferred income arrangements, stock, options, uncompleted contracts and other future benefits which you expect to derive from previous business relationships, professional services, firm memberships, etc).
22. Outside commitment during service in office: (Do you have any plans, commitments or agreements to pursue outside employment with or without compensation during your service in office? If so explain).
23. Sources of Income: (List sources and amounts of all income received during the calendar year preceding your nomination and in the current calendar year).
24. Tax Status: (State whether you have fully complied with your tax obligations to the State up to the end of the financial year immediately preceding the nomination for appointment).

25. Statement of Net Worth: (State your financial net worth).
 26. Potential Conflicts of Interest:
 - (a) Identify the family members or other persons, parties, categories of litigation or financial arrangements that are likely to present potential conflicts-of-interest when you first assume the position to which you have been nominated. Explain how you would address any such conflict if it were to arise.
 - (b) Explain how you will resolve any potential conflict of interest, including the procedure you will follow in determining these areas of concern.
 27. Pro-Bono/Charity Work/Donations to charity: (Describe what you have done by way of pro bono or charity work, listing specific instances, the amount contributed and the amount of time devoted to each).
 28. Have you ever been charged in a court or law in the last three years? If so specify the nature of the charge, where the matter is ongoing, the present status of the matter, or where the matter is concluded, the judgment of the court, or otherwise, how the case was concluded.
 29. Have you ever been adversely mentioned in an investigatory report of Parliament or any other Commission of inquiry in the last three years?
 30. Have you any objection to the making of enquiries with your present employer/interests in the course of consideration of your nomination?
