ABOLITION OF SLAVERY--BILL

The Crown Advocate moved the First Reading of the Bill: For the Abolition of the Legal Status of Slavery throughout the East Africa Protectorate, this being seconded by the Senior Commissioner was forthwith read a First time.

The Crown Advocate gave notice that he proposed to move the Second Reading at the next meeting of the Council.

SALE OF WINES AND SPIRITS--BILL

The Crown Advocate moved the First Reading of a Bill: For regulating the sales of wines, Spirits and Malt Liquors.

This being seconded by the Senior Commissioner was forthwith read a First time.

The Crown Advocate gave notice that he proposed to move the Second reading of this Bill at the next meeting of the Council.

LICENCES--OSTRICH FARMERS--BILL

The Crown Advocate moved the First Reading of a Bill: To authorise the issuing of licences to ostrich farmers for collecting of eggs of wild ostriches and for capturing of young ^{wild} ostriches.

This being seconded by the Senior Commissioner was forthwith read a First time.

The Crown Advocate gave notice that he proposed to move the

Second Reading of this Bill at the next meeting of the Council.

DISEASES OF ANIMALS-- BILL.

The Crown Advocate moved the First Reading of a Bill: To make further provision for preventing the spread of diseases among the animals.

This being seconded by the Senior Commissioner was forthwith read a First time.

The Crown Advocate gave notice that he proposed to move the Second Reading of this Bill at the next meeting of the Council.

BRANDING-- BILL

The Crown Advocate moved the First Reading of a Bill: To make provision for the registration of brands for stock and for compulsory branding of cattle and ostriches by farmers and owners.

This being seconded by the Senior Commissioner, was forthwith read a First time.

The Crown Advocate gave notice that he proposed to move the Second Reading of this Bill at the next meeting of the Council.

POLICE-- BILL.

The Crown Advocate moved the First Reading of a Bill: To amend the East Africa Police Ordinance of 1906.

This being seconded by the Senior Commissioner was forthwith read a First time.

The Crown Advocate gave notice that he proposed to move the Second Reading of this Bill at the next meeting of the Council.

MASTER AND SERVANT-- BILL.

The Crown Advocate moved the First Reading of the Bill: To amend the Master and Servant Ordinance of 1906.

This being seconded by the Senior Commissioner was

forthwith read a First time.

The Crown Advocate gave notice that he proposed to move the Second Reading of this Bill at the next meeting of the Council.

HIGH COURT-- BILL

The Crown Advocate moved the First Reading of a Bill: To define the powers of the High Court and to constitute and define the powers of the Courts subordinate thereto:

CUSTOMS DUTIES-- BILL

The Crown Advocate moved the First Reading of a Bill: To make better provision for the levying of Customs Duties in East Africa Protectorate and for the organisation and management of Customs Department.

This being seconded by the Senior Commissioner, was forthwith read a First time.

The Crown Advocate gave notice that he proposed to move the Second Reading of this Bill at the next meeting of the Council.

MUNICIPALITIES-- BILL.

The Crown Advocate moved the First Reading of a Bill: To provide for the establishing of Municipal Councils in certain townships in the Protectorate.

This being seconded by the Senior Commissioner, was forthwith read a First time.

The Crown Advocate gave notice that he proposed to move the Second Reading of this Bill at the next meeting of the Council.

VOLUNTEER RESERVE-- BILL

The Crown Advocate moved the First Reading of a Bill: To amend the East Africa Volunteer Reserve Ordinance of 1906.

The motion being seconded by the Senior Commissioner was forthwith read a First time.

The Crown Advocate gave notice that he proposed to move the Second reading of this Bill at the next meeting of the Council.
