CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

The Cabinet Secretary for Transport, Infrastructure, Housing and Urban Development published the Traffic (Driving Schools, Driving Instructors and Driving Licenses) Rules, 2018 on 26th of April, 2018 *vide* LN. No 81 of 2018 as a subsidiary legislation under the Traffic Act (*Cap 403*) Laws of Kenya.

Following publication, the Rules were tabled in the House on 13th June, 2018, being the 6th sitting day since publication, hence was within the statutory timelines contemplated under section 11(1) of the Statutory Instruments Act (hereinafter referred to as the Act). Attached to the Rules was an Explanatory Memorandum which was in line with Section 5A of the Act.

The Rules were subsequently committed to the Select Committee on Delegated Legislation for review and scrutiny in line with section 12 of the Act and Standing Order 210 of the National Assembly Standing Orders (SO).

Prior to the publication of the Rules, **the regulation-making authority (RMA), i.e., through the National Transport and Safety Authority (NTSA), the body mandated to operationalise the Rules** had presented the draft Rules in a workshop held on 20th April 2018 at Leisure Lodge in Kwale County. This was a joint workshop between the National Transport and Safety Authority, the National Assembly's Select Committee on Delegated Legislation and the Departmental Committee on Transport, Public Works and Housing. The Members of both Committees considered the draft Rules in line with the Act and other related legislations and **guided the National Transport and Safety Authority on the actions to take to ensure conformity with the relevant requirements stipulated under Article 2(4), 10, 94(6), 118 read together with the enabling provisions under the Traffic Act (Cap 403), the National Transport and Safety Authority Act and the Interpretation and General Provisions Act.**

NTSA undertook to realign the draft Rules with the stated provisions of the Constitution and the relevant statutes prior to publishing the Rules and subsequent tabling in Parliament for consideration. **The Authority however failed, ignored and/ or refused to incorporate the concerns of the two Committees and proceeded to publish the Rules on 26th April, 2018, vide Legal Notice 81 of 2018.**

1 | Report of the Committee on Delegated Legislation on the Traffic (Driving Schools, Driving Instructors and Driving Licences) Rules, 2018

The Director General of NTSA wrote to the Committee in a letter Ref. NTSA/C/RT004/2 VOL1 dated **25th June 2018** requesting for more time to incorporate the members' concerns to the Rules. He explained that there was little time between **20th April 2018** when the NTSA met the Committee and date of gazettelement of the Rules, i.e., **26th April 2018**.

The Committee turned down this request because NTSA failed to disclose that the draft Rules had been submitted to the Attorney General for publishing. In addition, the Committee observed that the Rules were already operational by effect of their publication pursuant to Section 23(1) of the Statutory Instruments Act and were therefore injurious to the public as published. The Committee, therefore, resolved to **annul the instrument** for the reasons that are advanced in Section 2.0 of this Report.

The Committee wishes to express its gratitude to the Speaker for the support accorded to the Committee in the discharge of its mandate. The Committee also wishes to record its appreciation to the Office of the Clerk of the National Assembly and the supporting Directorates for providing the necessary technical support to the Committee.

On behalf of the Members of the Select Committee on Delegated Legislation and pursuant to Standing Order 210 (4), it is my pleasure and duty to present to the House the Committee's Report on the Traffic (Driving Schools, Driving Instructors and Driving Licences) Rules, 2018.

1.0 PREFACE

1.1 Establishment and Mandate of the Committee

The Select Committee on Delegated Legislation is established pursuant to Standing Order No. 210 and is mandated to consider statutory instruments submitted to Parliament for consideration. The Committee is expected to consider in respect of any statutory instrument, whether it is in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, the Act pursuant to which it is made or other relevant written laws.

The Committee is mandated to consider in respect of any statutory instrument, whether it: -

- a) is in accordance with the provision of the Constitution, the Act pursuant to which it is made or other relevant written laws;
- b) infringes on fundamental rights and freedoms of the public;
- c) contains a matter which in the option of the Committee should more properly be dealt with in an Act of the Parliament;
- d) contains imposition of taxation;
- e) directly or indirectly bars the jurisdiction of the court;
- f) gives retrospective effect to any of the provision in respect to which the Constitution does not expressly give any such power;
- g) it involves expenditure from the consolidated fund or other public revenues;
- h) is defective in its drafting or for any reason form or part of the statutory instrument calls for any elucidation;
- i) appears to make some unusual or unexpected use of the power conferred by the Constitution or the Act pursuant to which it is made;
- j) appears to have had unjustifiable delay in its publication or laying before Parliament;
- k) makes rights, liberties or obligations unduly dependent upon non-renewable decisions;
- l) makes rights, liberties or obligations unduly dependent insufficiently defined administrative powers;
- m) inappropriately delegates legislative powers;
- n) imposes a fine, imprisonment or other penalty without express authority having been provided for in the enabling legislation;

- o) appears for any reason to infringe on the rule of law;
- p) inadequately subjects the exercise of legislative power to Parliamentary scrutiny; and
- q) accords to any other reason that the Committee considers fit to examine.

2.0 CONSIDERATION OF THE INSTRUMENT

2.1 Introduction and Background Information

The Traffic (Driving Schools, Driving Instructors and Driving Licenses) Rules, 2018 were made in exercise of the powers conferred on the Cabinet Secretary for Transport, Infrastructure, Housing and Urban Development by **section 119(1) (a) of the Traffic Act (Cap 403) Laws of Kenya**.

The Rules were published on 26th of April, 2018 **vide LN. No 81 of 2018** as a subsidiary legislation under the Traffic Act (*Cap 403*) Laws of Kenya.

The Rules apply to **driving schools, driving instructors and the issuance of driving licenses in Kenya**. The Rules seek to prohibit the operation of driving schools without valid driving school license and provide for the modalities of licensing of driving schools including mechanisms of application, issuance and validity of a ‘school license’.

On **driving instructors**, the Rules seek to prohibit any person, who does not hold an instructor’s licence issued by NTSA, from teaching for gain or reward the theory and practice of driving a motor vehicle. Similarly, the Rules mandate the authority (NTSA) to develop a curriculum and facilities for training and testing pupils, drivers and driving instructors.

On **driving license**, the Rules spell out the different classifications of the licenses to be issued. Under General matters the Rules create the offence of misrepresentation and alteration of license, general penalty for contravening the Rules, appeal mechanisms, transitional provisions and revocation of previous Rules.

Expected Benefits of the Rules

The expected benefits of the Rules are;

- i) standardised curriculum and facilities for training and testing of pupils, drivers and driving instructors; and
- ii) to provide for the modalities of licensing of driving schools including mechanisms of application, issuance and validity of a "school license".

2.2 Scrutiny of the Instrument

The Committee, at its sitting held on **26th June 2018**, examined the Traffic (Driving Schools, Driving Instructors and Driving Licences) Rules, 2018, in line with the Constitution, the Interpretations and General Provisions Act (*Cap 2*) Laws of Kenya, the Traffic Act (*Cap 403*), the National Transport and Safety Authority Act and the Statutory Instruments Act (*No 23 of 2013*).

Following publication, the Rules were tabled in the House on **13th June, 2018**, being the 6th sitting day since publication, hence was within the statutory timelines contemplated under section 11(1) of the Statutory Instruments Act. Attached to the Rules was an Explanatory Memorandum which was in line with Section 5A of the SI Act. The Rules were subsequently committed to the Select Committee on Delegated Legislation for review and scrutiny pursuant to section 12 of the Statutory Instruments Act (SI Act), 2013 and Standing Order 210 of the National Assembly Standing Orders.

Prior to the publication of the Rules, the **regulation-making authority (RMA)**, i.e., the **National Transport and Safety Authority (NTSA)** had presented the draft Rules in a workshop held on **20th April 2018** at Leisure Lodge in Kwale County. This was a joint workshop between the National Transport and Safety Authority, the Committee on Delegated Legislation and the Committee on Transport, Public Works and Housing. The Members of both Committees gave their views on the various provisions of the proposed Rules. NTSA undertook to incorporate these views prior to publishing the Rules and subsequent tabling in Parliament for consideration. It, therefore, came as a surprise to the Committee that the Rules were published on 26th April,

2018, vide Legal Notice 81 of 2018, as presented during the workshop, without the Committee's input. Nevertheless, the Committee considered the Rules in its sitting held on 26th June 2018.

The Director General of NTSA wrote to the Committee in a letter Ref. NTSA/C/RT004/2 VOL1 dated 25th June 2018 requesting for more time to incorporate the Members' concerns in the Rules. He explained that there was little time between 20th April 2018 when the NTSA met the Committee and the date of gazettelement of the Rules, i.e., 26th April 2018.

The Committee turned down this request because NTSA failed to disclose that the draft Rules had been submitted to the Attorney General for publishing. In addition, the Committee observed that the Rules were already operational by effect of their publication pursuant to Section 23(1) of the Statutory Instruments Act and were therefore injurious to the public as published.

The Committee, therefore, resolved to **annul the instrument** for the reasons advanced herein.

2.3 Committee Observations

Following comprehensive scrutiny of the Rules, the Committee made the following observations –

THAT,

- 1) **Rule 4(2)(d)** requires a driving school to be situated on, located in, or otherwise own six acres of land for Category 'A' and 'B' license and one acre for Category 'C' license. This was considered unconstitutional and a contravention of the land laws to the extent that it prescribes minimum acreage of land for an operation of an activity and also prohibitive and a contravention of the Traffic Act which has no such requirements hence contravening Section 13(a) of the Statutory Instruments Act which requires the committee to consider whether the Statutory Instrument is in accord with the provisions of the Constitution, the Act pursuant to which it is made or other written law. ;
- 2) **Rule 5 on validity of driving licenses provides that a school licence shall be valid for two years from the date of issue.** Pursuant to section 13(q) of the Act this was considered highly punitive to operators. It was the Committee's opinion that the Rules do not provide for a mechanism by which the Authority may withdraw the license of non-compliant schools, upon inspection;

- 3) **Rule 7 (2)(f)** on inspection of premises for determining the suitability of a proposed school, the Members observed that the requirement that a driving school should have other relevant equipment including computer, televisions, projector, video player or digital video disc player, **was considered prohibitive** and ought to be further reviewed;
- 4) **Rule 8(2)(a)** requires a school manager to have minimum qualifications of a **certificate in education**. The Committee observed that this provision is ambiguous and not specific on area of specialization as a certificate in Education implies that for any teacher and not necessarily a trainer in Driving School. The committee considered that contrary to section 13(h) of the Statutory Instruments Act as this provision is defective in its drafting or for any reason the form or purport of the Statutory instrument calls for elucidation.;
- 5) **Rule 12 (2)(a)** allows inspectors to enter the driving school premises during regular business hours or “**at any other time**”. The Committee observed that inspection “**at any other time**’ may amount to arbitrary search of property infringing on Article 31 of the Constitution on the right to privacy;
- 6) **Rule 16** provides for continuous development courses for driving instructors. The Committee observed that the proposal for instructors to undergo a minimum number of continuous development courses is punitive since the presumption is that one gets more experienced and better in any given trade with the advancement of years;
- 7) **Rule 24** read together with the Third Schedule to the Regulations is further unconstitutional by **discriminating citizens based on age in the operation of certain category of vehicles, thus contravening Article 27(4) and (5) of the Constitution on discrimination by a state agency based on age.**
- 8) **Rule 25 (1)** on validity of licenses requires drivers in Categories ‘A’, ‘B’, ‘F’ and ‘G’ to repeat a **driving examination every ten years and submit a duly filled medical examination report while drivers in Categories ‘C’, ‘D’ and ‘E’ will be required to repeat the driving examination every three years.** The Committee further observed that this provision is frivolous based on the natural justice presumption that, one gets more experienced and better in any trade with the advancement of years;


9) Rule 25 (2) further provides that drivers aged seventy (70) years and above will be required to apply for driving licenses annually and submit a medical examination report. The Committee observed that this requirement is discriminatory and ought to be re-considered as it contravenes Article 27(4) and (5) of the Constitution on discrimination by a state agency based on age; and that the provision is unreasonable.

10) Rule 26(4) is defective in drafting with the words “may” and “shall” used in the same sentence, contrary to section 13(h) of the Statutory Instruments Act.

The Committee also observed that the Rules ought to provide for minimum literacy levels for competence in driving to address concerns of licensed drivers who are not able to read road signs.

3.0 RECOMMENDATION

The Committee recommends that pursuant to Standing Order 210 (4) (b) and section 15 (1) of the SI Act, the Traffic (Driving Schools, Driving Instructors and Driving Licences) Rules, 2018 be annulled in entirety.

Minutes of the 38th sitting were read and confirmed as a true record of the proceedings having been proposed and seconded by Hon. Patrick Mariru, MP and Hon. Sammy Seroney, MP respectively.

MIN.NO. /NA/CDL/2018/227 CONSIDERATION OF THE TRAFFIC (DRIVING SCHOOLS, DRIVING INSTRUCTORS AND DRIVING LICENSES) RULES, 2018

The Chairperson informed the Committee that the Traffic (Driving Schools, Driving Instructors and Driving Licenses) Rules, 2018 were laid on the table of the House on the 13th of June, 2018 and committed to the Committee for consideration.

The Chairperson then welcomed the Legal Counsel to brief Members on the Rules. He informed the Committee THAT:

- (i) the Rules were published in the Kenya Gazette as *LN. No 81 of 2018* on 26th of April, 2018 and laid on the table of the House by the Leader of Majority Party on the 13th of June, 2018, being the 6th sitting day since publication, **hence was within the Statutory timelines contemplated under section 11(1) of the Statutory Instruments Act. The House was on recess between 4th May to 4th of June, 2018;**
- (ii) they were made pursuant to section 119(1)(a) of the Traffic Act (*Cap 403*) Laws of Kenya, which is the enabling section that empowers the Cabinet Secretary to make Rules;
- (iii) the Rules are in line with the Constitution, the Interpretations and General Provisions Act (*Cap 2*) Laws of Kenya, the Traffic Act (*Cap 403*), the National Transport and Safety Authority Act, the Statutory Instruments Act (*No 23 of 2013*);
- (iv) There was attached to the Rules a detailed Explanatory Memorandum which provides for the justification of the making of the Rules emphasizing that the instrument promotes road safety by providing guidelines on the licensing regime of driving schools and driving instructors, and that it provides the manner in which driving test examinations will be conducted and licenses issued based on different categories and the fees to be paid;

- (v) annexed to the Memorandum is a list of persons, institutions, stakeholders involved in the consultations at different stages especially in Nairobi, Naivasha and Machakos and the consultation outcomes therefrom; and
- (vi) there is further attached a copy of a newspaper cutting dated 19th of January, 2018 demonstrating that the National Transport and Safety Authority invited the public for comments on the instant Rules before the Committee prior to their publication.

Committee Observations

The Director General of NTSA wrote to the Committee in a letter Ref. NTSA/C/RT004/2 VOL1 dated 25th June 2018 requesting for more time to incorporate the Members' concerns in the Rules. He explained that there was little time between 20th April 2018 when the NTSA met the Committee and date of gazettelement of the Rules, i.e., 26th April 2018.

Members resolved to consider the Report on the Traffic (Driving Schools, Driving Instructors and Driving Licenses) Rules, 2018 on Tuesday, 3rd July, 2018.

The following issues were discussed –



2. The Committee tasked the secretariat to avail the Committee's budget expenditure for the FY 2017/2018.



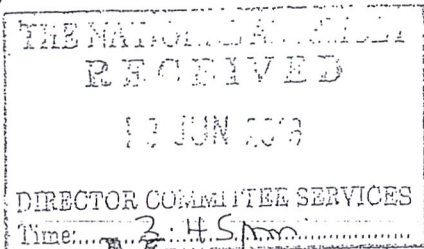

THE TRAFFIC ACT
(Cap. 403)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 119 (1) (ga) of the Traffic Act, the Cabinet Secretary for Transport, Infrastructure, Housing and Urban Development makes the following Rules —

THE TRAFFIC (DRIVING SCHOOLS, DRIVING INSTRUCTORS
AND DRIVING LICENCES) RULES, 2018
PART I—PRELIMINARY

1. These Rules may be cited as the Traffic (Driving Schools, Driving Instructors and Driving Licences) Rules, 2018. Citation.

2. In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Appeals Board” means the Transport Licensing Appeals Board established under section 39 of the National Transport and Safety Authority Act, 2012;

“Authority” means the National Transport and Safety Authority established under section 3 of the National Transport and Safety Authority Act, 2012;

“Cabinet Secretary” means the Cabinet Secretary for the time being responsible for matters relating to transport;

“certificate of competence” means a certificate issued by the test examiner to the effect that the person named therein has successfully undertaken a driving test;

“driving instructor” means a holder of a valid instructor’s licence;

“driving school” means an establishment, or premises used for teaching, for gain or reward, the theory and practice of driving motor vehicles;

“driving test” means a test conducted by a driving test examiner;

“driving test examiner” means a person appointed by the Authority to conduct driving test examinations”

“inspector” means the person designated as such by the Authority;

“instructor’s licence” means a licence issued under rule 14 that authorises the holder, for gain or reward, to engage, or hold himself out as being willing to engage, in teaching the theory and practice of driving a motor vehicle;

“licensing officer” means the person appointed as such by the Authority to issue driving licences;

“medical certificate” means a certificate signed by a medical practitioner registered by the Kenya Medical Practitioners’ and Dentists’ Board and accredited by the Directorate of Occupational Safety and Health Services;

“proprietor” means the owner of a driving school;

“pupil” means a person who is under instruction in the theory or practice of driving a motor vehicle by a driving instructor or driving school;

“school licence” means a licence issued under rule 4 authorizing the holder to set up or maintain an establishment for offering, for a fee, instruction on the driving of motor vehicles; and

“vehicle inspection report” means a report made by a person authorized by the Authority stating that following an examination, the person is satisfied that the vehicle specified in the report is suitable in all respects for use in the teaching of the practice of driving motor vehicle of the class concerned.

3. These Rules apply to driving schools, driving instructors and to the issuance of driving licenses in Kenya. Application.

PART II — DRIVING SCHOOLS

4. (1) A person shall not set up or maintain a driving school if he/she is not the holder of a valid school licence. Licensing of driving schools.

(2) An application for a school licence shall be made to the Authority in the form set out in the First Schedule and shall be accompanied by—

- (a) the fees set out in the Second schedule;
- (b) an original and copy of the certificate of registration of the applicant;
- (c) a title, lease or rental agreement of premises from which the driving school intends to operate;
- (d) a title, lease or rental agreement for a manoeuvring yard measuring at least one point six acres for a driving school licence under category A and B schools and one acre for a driving school licence under Category C;
- (e) a list of all the driving instructors including copies of their instructor's licences;
- (f) a list of the equipment and facilities available at the proposed school to be used for instruction of the learners;
- (g) a list of vehicles to be used by the school for instruction together with a vehicle inspection report dated not earlier than one month prior to the date of the application, of every motor vehicle;
- (h) a current comprehensive insurance cover for all the vehicles with a driver training school endorsement; and
- (i) such other information as may be necessary for the consideration of the application and as determined by the Authority.

5. A school licence shall be valid for two years from the date of issue. Validity of driving school licence.

6. (1) Upon considering an application for a school licence, the Authority may— Power of Authority.

- (a) issue a driving school licence with or without special conditions and ensure that any special conditions attached to the approval are duly endorsed on the licence; or
- (b) reject the application.

7. (1) In considering an application for a school licence for a new or existing driving school, an inspector shall inspect the premises referred to in the application as the intended location of the proposed school to ascertain whether the premises are suitable and adequately equipped for the purposes of the proposed school. Inspection of premises.

(2) In determining the suitability of a proposed school under sub rule (1), the Authority shall consider the availability of—

- (a) a reception area and waiting area;
- (b) a theory class room which seats at least eight students and each class shall have a floor area of at least two square metres;
- (c) separate toilets for men and women;
- (d) at least one model town board per theory room in the design approved by the Authority;
- (e) displayed road sign posters in the design approved by the Authority; and
- (f) other relevant equipment including computer, televisions, projector, video player or digital video disc player.

8. (1) A driving school shall have a school manager who shall — Administration and staffing.

- (a) ensure the preparation of all teaching materials according to the curriculum;
- (b) oversee the preparation and conduct of all internal examinations; and
- (c) perform all record keeping and reporting obligations of the school.

(2) The minimum qualifications for a school manager shall include—

- (a) a certificate in education; and
- (b) a valid instructor's licence.

(3) A driving school shall have a minimum of two driving instructors.

9. (1) A school licence—

- (a) shall exclusively authorize the use of the premises named therein as a driving school; and
- (b) is not transferable.

Restriction on use of driving school licence.

(2) A school licence may be issued by the Authority for a branch of a driving school in accordance with sub rule (3).

(3) The training premises at a location other than the primary site specified in an application for a school licence shall be licensed separately as a branch.

10. A driving school shall prominently display in its premises— Documents to be displayed.

- (a) the school licence issued by the Authority;
- (b) copies of the instructor's licences of all driving instructors employed by the driving school; and

(c) the regular office hours of the driving school.

11. (1) A driving school shall keep and maintain records and reports of the business activities of the driving school in a hard copy or electronic format and in a secure location for a period of at least three years. Records.

(2) The records kept under sub rule (1) shall include the—

- (a) names and copies of the instructor's licences of all the driving instructors employed;
- (b) insurance and inspection records of the vehicles that belong to the driving school;
- (c) attendance register of all pupils; and
- (d) record of all internal examinations conducted.

(3) The school shall make the records specified under sub rule (2) available to the Authority upon request.

(4) A driving school shall, by the thirty-first of January of every year, submit to the Authority, either in electronic or hard copy form, an annual report for the immediately preceding calendar year in a format that the Authority shall prescribe.

(5) A driving school shall immediately notify the Authority in writing of any vehicular accident involving its vehicles used in the training of pupils, resulting in a fatality.

12. (1) The Authority shall appoint such number of inspectors as it may consider necessary for the proper administration of these Rules. Driving school inspectors.

(2) An inspector may—

- (a) enter the premises of a driving school during the regular hours of business of the school, or at any other time, to —
 - (i) examine books, records, vehicles or other equipment used by or pertaining to the driving school; or
 - (ii) ascertain the standard of instruction given by the driving school; and
- (b) accompany a driving instructor engaged in giving instruction to a pupil, on behalf of a driving school, to examine and report on the standard of instructions given by the instructor.

(3) During an inspection, the proprietor, manager or person in charge of the school shall cooperate with the inspector and shall, on request, produce student records, instructional material and any other items necessary to complete the inspection.

13. (1) The Authority may suspend, revoke or vary any of the terms or conditions of a school licence if it is satisfied that— Suspension, revocation or variation of a school license.

- (a) the instructions given at the driving school do not adhere to or are not based on the approved curriculum issued by the Authority;

- (b) a motor vehicle being used for any of the purposes of the licence is not suitable for that purpose;
- (c) the school employs, hires or allows a person not licensed by the Authority as a driving instructor to give driving training and instruction to the pupils;
- (d) the proprietor, manager or person in charge of the driving school has within any period of three years been convicted of offences under these Rules; or
- (e) the driving school contravenes these Rules.

(2) In exercising any of the powers conferred under paragraph (1), the Authority shall —

- (a) give reasons for the action;
- (b) give the proprietor, manager or person in charge of the driving school an opportunity to make representations concerning the proposed exercise; and
- (c) hear and consider any such representations.

PART III—DRIVING INSTRUCTORS

14. (1) A person shall not, for gain or reward, teach the theory or practice of driving a motor vehicle unless that person has a valid instructor's licence issued by the Authority:

Licensing of driving
instructors.

Provided that, this rule shall not apply to any person solely due to —

- (a) any article contributed by him to a newspaper or other periodic publication; or
- (b) any advertisement made by or on behalf of the proprietor of the driving school.

(2) A person may apply for an instructor's licence if that person meets the minimum conditions for the relevant class of vehicles.

(3) An application for an instructor's licence shall be made to the Authority and shall be accompanied by—

- (a) the fees set out in the Second Schedule;
- (b) an application form set out in the Sixth Schedule.
- (c) a copy of the applicant's identification card or passport;
- (d) a valid certificate of good conduct;
- (e) the original and a copy of a valid driving licence; and
- (f) a duly filled medical examination report in the form set out in the Fifth Schedule.

(4) After consideration of an application for an instructor's licence, the Authority may —

- (a) issue an instructor's licence with or without special conditions; or

(b) reject the application.

15. An instructor's licence shall be valid for a period of two years from the date of issue. Validity of
Instructors' licence.

16. The Authority shall determine the minimum number of continuous development courses and approve the nature, content and duration of refresher courses to be attended by a driving instructor. Continuous
development courses.

17. Upon approval of the application for an instructor's licence, the Authority shall — Approved driver
instructor register.

- (a) allot an identifying number to the successful applicant; and
- (b) enter the applicant's details in the licensed driving instructor register which shall contain —
 - (i) the holder's full name;
 - (ii) the class in which the person is licensed to instruct;
 - (iii) the identifying number;
 - (iv) the validity period; and
 - (v) the details of any suspension, revocation or variation of terms and conditions of instructor licence.

18. (1) A driving instructor shall carry their instructor's licence at all times when instructing a pupil and shall produce it for inspection when requested by an authorized officer of the Authority or a police officer. Requirement to carry
instructor's licence.

(2) A driving instructor shall not instruct a pupil on any class of vehicle which the instructor is not authorized under his instructor's certificate to give instruction.

19. (1) The Authority may suspend, revoke, refuse to issue or renew an instructor's licence or vary the terms and conditions of an instructor's licence if— Suspension,
revocation or
variation of an
instructor licence.

- (a) the instruction given by the driving instructor does not adhere to or is not based on the curriculum approved by the Authority;
- (b) the driving instructor is incapable of giving proper instruction in the theory or practice of driving motor vehicles or of any class of motor vehicle;
- (c) the driving instructor engages in fraudulent or corrupt practices in securing a licence to drive a motor vehicle;
- (d) at any time during the giving of driving instruction, the driving instructor is found to have consumed intoxicating liquor;
- (e) any of the terms and conditions of the instructor's licence have not been complied with; or
- (f) the driving instructor contravenes these Rules.

(2) In exercising any of the powers under sub rule (1), the Authority shall give reasonable opportunity to the licence holder to

make representations concerning the proposed exercise and shall hear and consider any such representations.

(3) Where the Authority suspends, revokes or varies an instructor's licence under this rule, the Authority shall record the details in the licensed driving instructors register.

PART IV— DRIVING INSTRUCTION

20. The Authority shall develop the curriculum for training and testing of drivers and driving instructors and all driving instruction shall be in accordance with the approved curriculum. Curriculum and facilities.

21. (1) A person shall not use a vehicle as a driving school vehicle unless — Driving school vehicles.

- (a) the vehicle is in a class in respect of which the driving school concerned is authorized by the school licence to give instruction;
- (b) at the time of use, its registration details are specified on the school licence;
- (c) it is in good mechanical condition or roadworthy in all respects;
- (d) the proprietor holds —
 - (i) a vehicle inspection report in respect of that vehicle dated not more than one year prior to the date of such use; or
 - (ii) a current comprehensive policy of insurance covering such vehicle as a driving school vehicle.

(2) A person shall not use a motor vehicle, other than a motor cycle or invalid carriage, as a driving school vehicle unless the motor vehicle—

- (a) is equipped with —
 - (i) a minimum dual control facility of brake and clutch for manual transmission or dual brake facility for automatic transmission;
 - (ii) two reflecting mirrors so constructed and fitted as to enable both the pupil and the driving instructor, at all times, to be or become, aware of the presence (to the rear) of any other vehicle or object;
 - (iii) flashing directions indicators in full operating condition;
 - (iv) three-point safety belts in four places, two at the front and two at the rear;
 - (v) head restraints in four places, two at the front and two at the rear; and
 - (vi) a fire extinguisher of at least one kilogram in weight and a

first aid kit;

- (b) exhibits the name and address of the driving school; and
- (c) is marked in such a manner as to be clearly visible by a person at the front and at the rear of the vehicle with the words- "CAUTION-DRIVER UNDER INSTRUCTION".

(3) In this rule "use" means used by a driving school for giving instruction to a pupil in the practice of driving a motor vehicle and a motor vehicle shall be deemed to be so used at any time when a pupil of the driving school is present in the driver's seat of the vehicle.

22. (1) A proprietor or school manager or a person in charge of a driving school shall not permit an unlicensed driving instructor to give instruction to a pupil on the class of vehicles concerned. Unauthorized instructor.

(2) A proprietor, manager or person in charge of the school who contravenes sub rule (1) commits an offence.

23. (1) Where a pupil is being instructed in the practice of driving a motor vehicle — Instruction of a pupil.

(a) if the pupil so desires, not more than one passenger may be carried in the motor vehicle; and

(b) a passenger may not be carried in a motor vehicle of any other class of vehicle not designed for carrying passengers.

(2) A pupil shall be instructed in driving a motor vehicle for the period specified in the approved curriculum under rule 20.

(3) In this rule, "passenger" means any person, other than the driving instructor and the pupil under instruction; at the wheel of the vehicle but does not include an inspector travelling in the vehicle during his duties.

PART V — DRIVING LICENCES AND DRIVING EXAMINATIONS

24. A driving licence shall be classified into the categories set out in the Third Schedule. Categories of driving licenses.

25. (1) A driving license in categories A, B, F and G, that is issued to a driver who is under the age of seventy years, shall be renewed after every three years over a nine-year period from the date of first issue and upon payment of the fees set out in the Second Schedule: Validity of licence

Provided that, the tenth year, the licence holder shall repeat the driving examination and submit a duly filled medical examination report in the form set out in the Fifth Schedule.

(2) A driving licence in categories A, B, F and G, that is issued to a driver who is at least seventy years of age, shall be renewed annually and the licence holder shall submit a duly filled medical examination report in the form set out in the Fifth Schedule.

(3) A driving license in categories C, D and E, that is issued to a driver, shall be renewed after every three years and shall be subject to the following conditions —

- (a) that the driver repeats the driving examination after every three years; and
- (b) that the driver has attended the required number of annual continuous development courses as determined by the Authority.

26. (1) A driving school shall apply for a driving examination on behalf of a pupil —

Application for driving examination.

- (a) after conducting an internal driving examination and the pupil is successful in the examination; and
- (b) in the form set out in the Fourth Schedule and accompanied by the fees set out in the Second Schedule.

(2) The application for a driving examination under sub rule (1) shall be accompanied by a duly filled medical examination report in the form set out in the Fifth Schedule.

(3) For purposes of the driving examination, the driving school shall provide a vehicle that is in roadworthy condition and of the class specified in the application form referred to in this rule.

(4) A driver may shall apply for a driving examination under rule 25 in the form set out in the Fourth Schedule.

27. (1) The Authority shall conduct a driving examination that shall at the minimum consist of —

Driving test examination.

- (a) a practical driving examination conducted over a minimum distance of five kilometres; and
- (b) a theoretical driving examination which shall examine the driver's knowledge of the Highway Code and traffic signs.

(2) A driving test examiner shall keep and maintain a driving examination register containing—

- (a) the name and address of each applicant for a driving test;
- (b) the serial number of the test application form;
- (c) the date on which such test was given;
- (d) the result of such test; and
- (e) if the applicant was issued with a certificate of competence, the number of the certificate and class of vehicles to which it related.

(3) A person who has passed a driving test to drive a motor vehicle of a particular class shall not, by virtue thereof, be considered to have passed a driving test to drive a motor vehicle of any other class unless that person has passed a test to drive a motor vehicle of that other class.

(4) A person who has passed a driving test shall be required to display the "L" sign on the motor vehicle that person is driving for a period of one year from the date of issue of the driving licence:

Provided that this sub rule does not apply to a driver who is renewing their driving licence.

(5) A person who contravenes sub rule (4) commits an offence.

PART VI — GENERAL

28. (1) A person who —

- (a) makes a statement in an application or record issued or made for any purposes under these Rules, which to his knowledge is false or in any respect misleading, or which that person does not believe to be true; or
- (b) makes a material alteration in a licence or record issued or kept under these Rules,

commits an offence.

Misrepresentation and alteration of licence.

(2) A person convicted of an offence under this rule, in respect of an application for a licence, shall not be eligible to hold any licence under these rules for a period of two years after the date of such conviction.

29. A person who commits an offence under these Rules for which no penalty is provided, is liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty thousand shillings or imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months or to both.

General penalty.

30. A person who is aggrieved by a decision of the Authority under these Rules may, within thirty days of receipt of the notification of such decision, appeal to the Appeals Board.

Appeal.

31. (1) A person, who before the commencement of these Rules held a valid school licence, an instructor's licence or a driving examiner's licence shall within a period of six months following the commencement of these Rules or otherwise upon the expiry of the licence, whichever is earlier, apply for a new licence.

Transitional provisions.

(2) A person who has applied for a new licence under these Rules may continue to operate under the terms of the licence they are holding until the application for a licence under these Rules has been determined.

(3) A person who fails to apply for a new licence under these Rules within the prescribed period shall cease to operate the licensed activity upon the expiry of the licence or after a period of six months following the commencement of these Rules, whichever is earlier.

(4) A person who held the position of inspector or examiner under the previous Rules shall cease to hold that position upon the expiry of a period of ninety days following the commencement of these Rules, unless the person is appointed to the same position by the Authority.

32. The Traffic (Driving Schools) Rules, 1971 are revoked.

Revocation of L.N. No. 232 of 1971.

- a title, lease or rental agreement of premises from which the driving school intends to operate;
- a title, lease or rental agreement for a manoeuvring yard measuring at least one point six acres for a school licence under category A and B;
- a title, lease or rental agreement for a manoeuvring yard measuring at least one acre for a school licence under category C;
- a list of driving instructors including copies of their driving instructor licences;
- a vehicle inspection report dated not earlier than one month prior to the date of the application, for every motor vehicle listed to be used by the driving school;
- a copy of the curriculum (to be returned to applicant); and
- a current comprehensive insurance cover for all the vehicles with a driver training school endorsement.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM TO THE TRAFFIC (DRIVING SCHOOLS, DRIVING INSTRUCTORS AND DRIVING LICENCES) RULES, 2018

Name of the Statutory Instrument: The Traffic (Driving Schools, Driving Instructors and Driving Licences) Rules, 2018

Name of the Parent Act: The Traffic Act, CAP 403

Enacted Pursuant to: Section 119 of The Traffic Act

Name of the Ministry/ Department: Ministry of Transport, Infrastructure and Urban Development/ State Department of Transport.

PART II

1. Purpose of the statutory instrument

To regulate driving schools, driving instructors and issuance of driving licences.

2. Legislative Context

The statutory instrument in question provides a legal framework for the operations of driving schools, instructors and issuance of driving licences.

3. Policy Background

The key policy objective of the NTSA Act is to ensure road safety and a sustainable and well organized road transport system. This instrument promotes road safety by providing guidelines on the licensing regime of driving schools and driving instructors. It provides the manner in which driving test examinations will be conducted and driving licences will be issued based on various categories. The regulations provide for the prescribed forms to be filled upon application of a driving school licence and the prescribed fees, categories of driving schools and the prescribed forms for the application for a driving examination.

Currently the operation of driving schools, licencing of instructors and issuance of driving licences is unregulated. This has led to an increase in proliferation of unlicensed driving schools and instructors who provide poor driver training and

testing, which has led to the increase of unskilled drivers on our roads. In order to address this challenge there is need to bring the sector into a regulatory regime to enhance safety by providing better training and testing for drivers by qualified instructors.

4. Consultation outcome

The Ministry and the National Transport and Safety Authority issued a public notice in a paper of national circulation inviting members of the public for their comments. In addition, public participation forums were held by the Authority in Nairobi, Machakos and Naivasha. The public submitted their comments some of which were included in the final rules. (Attached are the public participation registers for ease of reference)

4.2 The Ministry of Transport and Infrastructure intends to provide support to further create awareness on the rules through advertisements in the media and forums.

5. Impact

5.1 The regulations shall have no fundamental effect to rights and freedoms.

5.2 The regulations will help streamline the operations of driving schools, instructors and issuance of driving licences.

6. Monitoring and review

6.1 The success criteria of these rules will be an improvement in conducting driver training and testing in Kenya.

President Uhuru Kenyatta yesterday declared that Kenya would not be cowed by terrorists as the Kenya Defence Forces mounted a counter-offensive against Al-Shabaab bases in Somalia.

Although the Chief of Defence Force, Gen Samson Mwaithethe, described the counter-attacks as "a delicate operation", military planes conducted air strikes against Al-Shabaab while on the ground, tactical units used armoured vehicles to hit the terrorists' camps in retaliation for the Friday raid against a KDF camp in El Adde, Somalia.

"We shall defend our country by all means and we will unite with other countries in the region to defeat these terrorists," the President warned when he addressed a gathering at Lang'o Baya Primary School, grounds in Kiira County.

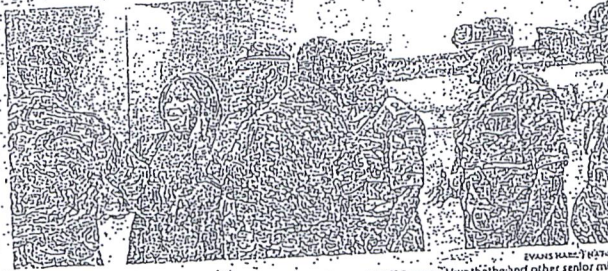
"We shall defend our country and we will injure a region, fight and defeat them to ensure we live in peace."

He asked Kenyans to support the military campaign in Somalia.

"We need to give them our full support because it is through their sacrifice and selflessness that we are able to enjoy the current peace and development," he said.

"Without the work they are doing (in Somalia) there cannot be development," said the President.

And speaking in Nairobi after receiving another group of soldiers who were injured in the Friday

attack, Gen Mwaithethe said the operation was a cautious undertaking because the military believes there are several Kenyan soldiers being held captive.

"We have information to the effect that some soldiers are being used as human shields," he said.

Besides the bombing of Al-Shabaab bases, KDF soldiers were also engaged in a search and rescue mission, which entered its fourth day yesterday. The aim of the mission is to find missing or injured Kenyan soldiers. The operation was also aimed at recovering bodies of those who died in combat.

By yesterday, no soldiers who survived the Friday attack had been transferred to Nairobi.

"This morning, another group of heroes have returned. They have no

physical injuries but are exhausted because of the ordeal they went through," said Defence Cabinet Secretary Raychelle Omamo at Wilson Airport in Nairobi yesterday, after receiving 10 survivors who arrived aboard a Kenya Air Force plane at noon.

Four others who were injured arrived on Sunday at noon, while another group was flown in later that evening.

Gen Mwaithethe, Army Commander Leonard Ng'omol and Air Force Commander Samuel Tinda were also at the airport to receive the soldiers yesterday.

Except one soldier, who walked out of the plane with slight limp, they all looked fit. Some emerged from the plane with their rifles. Among the survivors were those

who endured long walks to the border where they were received in other KDF camps.

There are others still hiding in the bush. They had sent signals that they are still alive and were willing to be picked up and flown to Kenya.

Ms Omamo said the number of soldiers killed would be made public once the operation ends. Bodies of those killed in battle were expected in Nairobi last evening.

At the same time, military headquarters announced four helicopters and urged relatives of soldiers to call and get information about the fate of their loved ones.

They are 0792780862 at Defence headquarters, 0792780863 at Defence Forces Memorial Hos-

pital, 0792780864 at 001 and 0792780865 in Embaki barracks.

On Sunday, Gen Mwaithethe said: "To our families, who have taken every step with us, thank you. I assure you that KDF fraternity will stand with you till the end."

Speaking in the Nyeri District, Dim Kuyu County, where he had accompanied the President to launch the \$300 million Baricho Water Project, National Assembly Majority Leader Adam Dulle asked the government to increase the number of soldiers in Somalia.

"The government should make that they are still alive and were willing to be picked up and flown to Kenya," he said.

"We must not be cowardly by terrorists and should destroy them for the region to enjoy peace and prosperity."

The opposition coalition, Cord, yesterday urged the government to declare two days of national mourning in honour of the fallen soldiers.

Separately, Amant National Congress leader, Mwalimu Mideve called for a decisive move by the government to defeat the Al-Shabaab.
