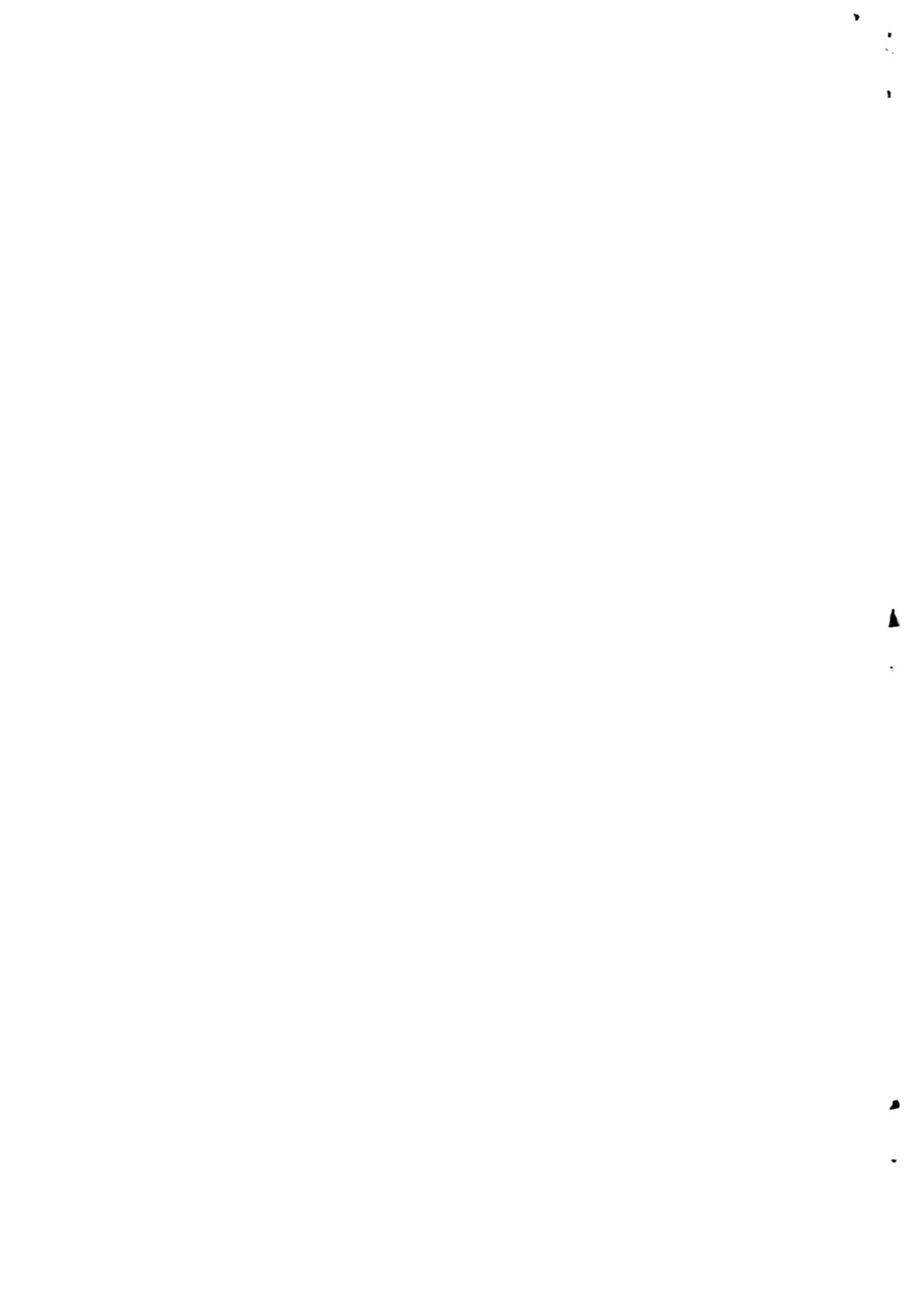

CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

On Wednesday 1st February 2017 the Deputy Speaker of the National Assembly conveyed a message from H.E the President regarding the nomination of the Dr. Jane Wangui Kiringai for appointment as the Chairperson to the Commission on Revenue Allocation (CRA) pursuant to Standing Order No. 42(1). In furtherance of the provisions of Article 215 (2) (a) of the Constitution and sections (3) and (5) of the Parliamentary Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, the Deputy Speaker of the National Assembly referred the credentials of the nominee to the Departmental Committee on Finance, Planning & Trade for vetting.

The nominee was vetted based on the criteria set in the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act 2011, Leadership and Integrity Act 2012 as well as the Constitution of Kenya 2010 and other relevant provisions of the law.

After vetting, the Dr. Jane Wangui Kiringai was found qualified and suitable to serve as Chairperson of the Commission on Revenue Allocation.

The Committee appreciates the assistance provided by the Office of the Speaker and the Clerk of the National Assembly that enabled it to discharge its mandate during the approval hearings. I further wish to express my appreciation to the Honourable Members of the Committee who dedicated their time to participate in the activities of the Committee and preparation of this Report. It is therefore my pleasant duty and privilege, on behalf of the Departmental Committee on Finance, Planning & Trade, to table its Report in the House on the vetting of the nominee for appointment as the Chairperson to the Commission of Revenue Allocation for consideration and adoption by the House in accordance with the provisions of Article 250 (2) (a) of the Constitution.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report contains the Committee's proceedings of the approval hearings of Dr. Jane Wangui Kiringai for appointment as the Chairperson to the Commission on Revenue Allocation (CRA). Dr. Wangui had been nominated by H.E the President in accordance with the provisions of Article 215(2)(a) of the Constitution of Kenya and the same communicated to the Speaker of the National Assembly by the Chief of Staff and of the Public Service vide his letter dated 31st January 2017. Through her communication from the Chair on 1st February 2017 and Pursuant to Article 215 (2)(b) of the Constitution, sections (3) and (5) of the Parliamentary Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011 and Standing Order 216(5)(f) referred the name of the nominee and her curriculum vitae to the departmental Committee on finance, Planning & Trade for vetting.

After the expiry of the term of the inaugural Commission's term on 31st December 2016, the National Assembly approved the new Commissioners for appointment by H. E the president during its Special sitting of 20th December 2016. At the time of this approval, H.E. had not submitted his for appointment as the Chairperson Pursuant to Article 215(2)(a) of the Constitution. The swearing in of the new Commissioners has been delayed pending appointment of the Chairperson.

On Tuesday 14th February 2017 the Committee vetted the nominee based on the criteria set out in Article 215 of the Constitution, Section 6 (1) of the Commission on Revenue Allocation Act and the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act of 2011. During vetted the Committee observed that the nominee had been cleared for appointment as the Chairperson of the Commission on Revenue Allocation by the KRA, CID, EACC, & HELB.

On her suitability for appointment, the Committee found Dr. Wangui suitable and qualified to serve as the Chairperson of the Commission on Revenue Allocation having worked as an economist at various within the National Treasury and the World Bank for almost three decades. It is worth noting that Section 6 the Commission on Revenue Allocation Act 2011 obligates the appointing authority to consider only applicants with a least fifteen years' experience in either financial or economic matters as the Chairperson of the CRA.

1.1 MANDATE OF THE COMMITTEE

The Committee on Finance, planning & Trade is one of the Departmental Committees of the National Assembly established under Standing Order 216 and mandated:

- (a) to investigate, inquire into, and report on all matters relating to the mandate, management, activities, administration, operations and estimates of the assigned ministries and departments;
- (b) to study the programme and policy objectives of ministries and departments and the effectiveness of the implementation;
- (c) to study and review all legislation referred to it;
- (d) to study, assess and analyse the relative success of the ministries and departments as measured by the results obtained as compared with their stated objectives;
- (e) to investigate and inquire into all matters relating to the assigned ministries and departments as they may deem necessary and as may be referred to them by the House;
- (f) to vet and report on all appointments where the Constitution or any law requires the National Assembly to approve, except those under Standing Order 204 (*Committee on Appointments*); and**
- (g) make reports and recommendations to the House as often as possible, including recommendation of proposed legislation.

The Committee is mandated to consider subject matters relating to public finance, monetary policies, public debt, financial institutions, investment and divestiture policies, pricing policies, banking, insurance, population, revenue policies, planning, national development, trade, tourism promotion and management, commerce and industry (growth of the industries in Kenya especially the small businesses).

1.4 RECOMMENDATION

The National Assembly approves the nomination of **Dr. Wangui Kiringai** for appointment, by H.E. the President, as the Chairperson of the Commission on Revenue Allocation pursuant to Articles 215(2) (a) of the Constitution.

2.0 BACKGROUND INFORMATION

2.1 Legal provisions

The Commission on Revenue Allocation (CRA) is an independent Commission established under Article 215 of the Constitution and assigned functions in Article 216 of the Constitution. Its core mandate is to recommend the basis for equitable sharing of revenues raised nationally between the National and the County Governments, and among the County governments.

Article 215(2) of the Constitution provides for the membership of the Commission, which is as follows —

215(2) The Commission shall consist of the following persons appointed by the President —

(a) a chairperson, who shall be nominated by the President and approved by the National Assembly;

(b) two persons nominated by the political parties represented in the National Assembly according to their proportion of members in the Assembly;

(c) five persons nominated by the political parties represented in the Senate according to their proportion of members in the Senate; and

(d) the Principal Secretary in the Ministry responsible for finance.

(3) The persons nominated under clause (2) shall not be members of Parliament.

(4) To be qualified to be a member of the Commission under clause (2) (a), (b) or (c), a person shall have extensive professional experience in financial and economic matters.

Section 9(2) of the Commission on Revenue Allocation Act, No.16 of 2011 Laws of Kenya provides that persons appointed as members of the Commission shall serve for a period of six years and will not be eligible for re-appointment. The inaugural Commission's term expired on 31st December 2016.

2.2 Nomination of Dr. Jane W. Kiringai

H.E the President, in exercise of powers vested in him under Article 215(2) (a) of the Constitution and provisions of sections (3) and (5) of the Parliamentary Appointments (Parliamentary Act,

2011, nominated Dr. Jane Kiringai for appointment as the Chairperson of the Commission on Revenue Allocation. Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 215 (2) (a), information on how the President arrived at the nominee was not made available to the Committee.

2.3 Message of the name of the nominee

Through his letter to the Speaker of the National Assembly dated 31st January 2016, the Chief of Staff and Head of Public Service forwarded the name of H. E the President's nominee for appointment as the Chairperson of the Commission on Revenue Allocation. On Wednesday 1st February 2017 the Deputy Speaker of the National Assembly referred the name of the nominee and her curriculum vitae to the Departmental Committee on Finance, Planning & Trade to conduct approval hearings. She urged the Committee to present its report to the House by 15th February 2017 for debate.

2.4 Committee proceedings

During the approval hearings, the Committee held a total of two meetings.

2.5 Notification to public and submission of memoranda

On Friday 3rd February, 2017 through the Print Media, the Clerk of the National Assembly notified the general public of Committee's vetting programme and requested for memoranda by way of written statement on oath (**sworn affidavit**) regarding the nominees' suitability to serve or otherwise. By the time of vetting on Tuesday 14th February 2017 the Committee had not received any memorandum.

Section 6(9) of the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act (No.33 of 2011) provides that *"any person may, prior to the approval hearing and by a written statement on oath, provide the Clerk with evidence contesting the suitability of a candidate to hold the office to which the candidate has been nominated"*.

2.6 Clearance requirements

On 2nd February 2017, the Clerk of the National Assembly wrote to the nominee informing her of her nomination for the position of the Chairperson of the Commission on Revenue Allocation and requested her to appear for vetting by the Departmental Committee on Finance, Planning & Trade on Tuesday 14th February 2017. He further requested the nominee to bring with her the clearance

certificates from the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission (EACC); Kenya Revenue Authority (KRA), Higher Education Loans Board (HELB); Criminal Investigation Department (CID); and any of the Credit reference bureaus.

On the same date, the Clerk of the National Assembly wrote to the KRA, HELB, EACC, and CID requesting for tax compliance, loan repayments, integrity and criminal record status respectively of the nominee. By the time of vetting and compiling this report, none of these agencies had objected to the appointment of the nominee.

3.0 APPROVAL HEARINGS

The Committee met with the nominee on Tuesday 14th February 2017 and conducted approval hearings. During the vetting, the Committee was guided by the Constitution; Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act; Commission on Revenue Allocation Act, Standing Orders and other relevant statutes. Specifically, the nominee was examined on the following criteria as set out in the Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act No. 33 of 2011:-

- Academic qualifications
- Employment record (whether the nominee had ten years' experience in finance and economics)
- Professional affiliations
- Potential conflict of interest
- Knowledge of the relevant subject
- Integrity
- Vision and leadership
- Expectations and key priorities

(a) Self-introduction and Educational Background

She informed the Committee that she is a Kenyan citizen born on 5th March 1963 in Nyeri County. She holds a PhD in Economics from University of Nottingham (2010), UK, Master's Degree in Development Economics from Williams College USA (1998), Bachelor of Philosophy (1992) and BSC in Statistics and Computer Science (1988) all from University of Nairobi.

(b) Employment record

Dr. Kiringai informed the Committee that she has worked for the following entities:

- World Bank Kenya Country Office as a Senior Economist from December 2008 to date. She undertakes economic analytical work in the areas of macroeconomic policy and economic growth, international trade, public finance and public expenditure management.
- Between 2006 and 2008, she worked as a senior economic advisor to the European Commission Delegation Kenya. She advised on budgetary support and Private Sector Development and Tourism.

- Between 2000 and 2006, she worked as a policy analyst with the Kenya Institute for Public Policy Research and Analysis (KIPPRA), Macroeconomic Division, during which period she undertook extensive research on macroeconomic policy, international trade and poverty, taxation, public expenditure management tracking and efficiency.

As a member of the KIPPRA macro modelling team she provided technical support to the government through the KIPPRA/Treasury Macro Model, for growth forecasts and projections and in response to other in-depth policy questions.

- Between 1999 and 2000, she was the head of statistics to the International Committee on Red Cross.
- Between 1989 and 1998, she worked for the Ministry of Finance as a Senior Economist where she was responsible for the formulation of the aggregate fiscal framework including budget policy and expenditure framework, setting budget ceilings for ministries and departments, quarterly disbursement schedules and all matters relating to ministerial budgets.

(c) Publications

Dr. Kiringai informed the Committee that she has published several book Chapters and policy briefs on financial matters. Key among them was the paper touching on drought, which could be relevant today as Kenya is grappling with drought mitigation and its aftermath. She recommended that EAC should accelerate regional integration to realize standardization food prices in the region. This would help movement of food freely and cheaply from areas of plenty to scarcity areas.

(d) What the nominee will bring to the table at CRA.

Dr. Kiringai informed the Committee that while working for the World Bank, she led a team that developed capacity building modules for counties in Public Finance Management. At the same time, the team built a comprehensive database on revenue expenditure for counties. This work places her at an advantaged position in determining the needs of counties and the amount of resources that should be devolved to and among counties.

The nominee further assured the Committee that she has developed a lot competencies and interpersonal skills while working for the World Bank as it involved regular engagements with both the Council of Governors and the Executive branch of the National Government.

(e) Her take on the Current Revenue Sharing Formula and Equalization Fund

Dr. Kiringai opined that the current revenue sharing formula requires a review to reflect the current economic realities on the ground and the cultural practices among the Kenyan Communities. She however indicated that there should be extensive discussions with all the stakeholders during the process of developing the formula and determination of the areas to benefit from the Equalization Fund. This will ensure that Kenyans will get equal services from the both the National and the County Governments irrespective of the areas/counties they come from.

(f) On staffing of Counties

Dr. Kiringai informed the Committee that she would prefer a workforce at counties that the requisite skills to perform their functions.

(g) Pro-Bono/ Charity work/ Donations to Charity

Dr. Kiringai informed the Committee that she supports Barnados children home regularly with about Kshs. 50,000 a year and other charitable activities through church including paying school fees for the orphans.

(h) Clearance requirements.

Dr. Kiringai confirmed to the Committee that she had no integrity issues, had no criminal records, had complied with her tax obligations, and had fully paid her HELB loan.

4.0 COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

The Committee having considered the curriculum vitae and heard oral submissions during the vetting exercise/interview, made the following observations:-

4.1 Nomination Process

She was duly nominated for appointment as the Chairperson of the Commission on Revenue Allocation as per Article 215(2) (a) of the Constitution and sections (3) and (5) of the Parliamentary Appointments (Parliamentary Act, 2011).

4.2 Composition of the Commission

After the expiry of the term of the inaugural Commission's term on 31st December 2016, the National Assembly approved the new Commissioners for appointment by H. E the president during its Special sitting of 20th December 2016. At the time of this approval, H.E. had not submitted his for appointment as the Chairperson Pursuant to Article 215(2)(a) of the Constitution. Upon approval of the nominee for the position of the Chairperson, the new Commission on Revenue Allocation will appear as itemized in the table below:

From the table above, it can be inferred that Article 27(8) of the Constitution on two-thirds Gender rule has been met. The same is true for Article 250(4) regional and ethnic diversity of the people of Kenya.

4.3 Memoranda from the public

As at the time of compiling this report, the Committee had not received any memoranda from the public on the suitability or otherwise of the nominee to serve as the Chairperson of the Commission on revenue Allocation.

4.4 Clearance requirements

As at the time of compiling this report, none of the clearing offices (CID, KRA, HELB, EACC & CRA had raised objections for appointment of all the nominees.

4.5 Observations specific to the nominee

- i) She is a Kenyan citizen born on 5th March 1963 in Nyeri County.
- ii) She holds a PhD in Economics from University of Nottingham, UK, (2010), a Masters degree in economic development from the Williams College in USA (1998), Bachelors in Statistics and Computer Science (1988) from the University of Nairobi.
- iii) She is currently working as a Senior Economist at the World Bank Kenya Country office.
- iv) She has a wealth of experience in economic matters having worked for almost three decades in the economic sector that would help her discharge her mandate as the Chairperson of the CRA. Her career is itemized in the table below:



- ix) On qualification for appointment as the Chairperson of the Commission on Revenue Allocation as provided for under Article 215(2) (a) and section 6(1) (b) of the Commission on Revenue Act, the Committee found the nominee suitable and qualified.

5.0 COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

Having conducted approval hearings for the nominee pursuant to Articles 118 of the Constitution; the Commission on Revenue Allocation Act, Public Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act; Standing Orders and other relevant statutes, the Committee recommends that:

The National Assembly approves the nomination of **Dr. Jane Wangui Kiringai** for appointment, by H.E. the President, as the Chairperson of the Commission on Revenue Allocation pursuant to Articles 215(2) (a) of the Constitution and section 5 of the Commission on Revenue Allocation Act, 2011

- Between 2000 and 2006, she worked as a policy analyst with the Kenya Institute for Public Policy Research and Analysis (KIPPRA), Macroeconomic Division, during which

period she undertook extensive research on macroeconomic policy, international trade and poverty, taxation, public expenditure management tracking and efficiency.

As a member of the KIPPRA macro modelling team she provided technical support to the government through the KIPPRA/Treasury Macro Model, for growth forecasts and projections and in response to other in-depth policy questions.

- Between 1999 and 2000, she was the head of statistics to the International Committee on Red Cross.
- Between 1989 and 1998, she worked for the Ministry of Finance as a Senior Economist where she was responsible for the formulation of the aggregate fiscal framework including budget policy and expenditure framework, setting budget ceilings for ministries and departments, quarterly disbursement schedules and all matters relating to ministerial budgets.

(c) Publications

She informed the Committee that she has published several book Chapters and policy briefs on financial matters. Key among them was the paper touching on drought, which could be relevant today as Kenya is grappling with drought mitigation and its aftermath. She recommended that EAC should accelerate regional integration to realize standardization food prices in the region. This would help movement of food freely and cheaply from areas of plenty to scarcity areas.

(d) What the nominee will bring to the table at CRA.

Dr. Kiringai informed the Committee that while working for the World Bank, she led a team that developed capacity building modules for counties in Public Finance Management. At the same time, the team built a comprehensive database on revenue expenditure for counties. This work places her at an advantaged position in determining the needs of counties and the amount of resources that should be devolved to and among counties.

The nominee further assured the Committee that she has developed a lot competencies and interpersonal skills while working for the World Bank as it involved regular engagements with both the Council of Governors and the Executive branch of the National Government.

(e) Her take on the Current Revenue Sharing Formulae and Equalization Fund

Dr. Kiringai opined that the current revenue sharing formulae requires a review to reflect the current economic realities on the ground and the cultural practices among the Kenyan Communities. She however indicated that there should be extensive discussions with all the stakeholders during the process of developing the formulae and determination of the areas to benefit from the Equalization Fund. This will ensure that Kenyans will get equal services from the both the National and the County Governments irrespective of the areas/counties they come from.

(f) On staffing of Counties

She informed the Committee that she would prefer a workforce at counties that the requisite skills to perform their functions.

(g) Pro-Bono/ Charity work/ Donations to Charity

Dr. Kiringai informed the Committee that she supports Barnados children home regularly with about Kshs. 50,000 a year and other charitable activities through church including paying school fees for the orphans.

(h) Clearance requirements.

Dr. Kiringai confirmed to the Committee that she had no integrity issues, had no criminal records, had complied with her tax obligations, and had fully paid her HELB loan.

COMMITTEE OBSERVATIONS

Having listened to the nominee the Committee observed as follows:-

- i) She is a Kenyan citizen born on 5th March 1963 in Nyeri County.
- ii) She holds a PhD in Economics from University of Nottingham, UK, (2010), a Masters degree in economic development from the Williams College in USA (1998), Bachelors in Statistics and Computer Science (1988) from the University of Nairobi.
- iii) She is currently working as a Senior Economist at the World Bank Kenya Country office.

- iv) She has a wealth of experience in economic matters having worked for almost three decades in the economic sector that would help her discharge her mandate as the Chairperson of the CRA. Her career is itemized in the table below:

Honourable Members,

Pursuant to the provisions of Standing Order No. 42(1) of the National Assembly Standing Orders, I wish to report to the House that I have received a Message from His Excellency the President, seeking the National Assembly's approval of the nominee for appointment as Chairperson of the Commission on Revenue Allocation (CRA). In the Message, His Excellency the President conveys that, in exercise of powers vested in him under Article 215(2)(a) of the Constitution and pursuant to the provisions of sections (3) and (5) of the Parliamentary Appointments (Parliamentary Approval) Act, 2011, he has nominated **Dr. Jane W. Kiringai** for appointment as the Chairperson of the Commission on Revenue Allocation (CRA).

Honourable Members,

Section 8 of the said Act provides that the relevant Committee of the House will consider the suitability or otherwise of the nominee and table its report for consideration by the House within fourteen (14) days from the date when the notification of nomination is conveyed to the House. Further, the Act requires that the public be given seven (7) days notification to submit their views regarding the suitability

or otherwise of the nominee proposed for appointment to an office requiring Parliamentary approval.

In this regard, and in accordance with the provision of Article 259(5)(a) of the Constitution as read together with section 5 of the said Act, the seven (7) days' notification to the public shall start running on the day following the day when the notice is published in the dailies.

Honourable Members, given the critical role played by the Commission for Revenue Allocation (CRA) within the framework of issues of Division of Revenue, which are currently under consideration within the budget process, it is advisable that the concerned Committee expeditiously proceeds to notify the nominee and the public. Indeed, it should be noted that the House approved the Commissioners of the CRA on December 20, 2016, and their swearing-in has been stayed, pending the appointment of a substantive Chairperson.

In this regard, the Committee should commence the approval hearings after the seven day notification period, and table a Report **on or before Wednesday, February 15, 2017**, to enable the House to consider the matter within the statutory timelines. This Message, together with the resume of the nominee stand committed to the Departmental Committee on Finance, Planning and Trade for consideration.

The policy notes highlight policy priorities for the new government in Kenya and cover 14 policy areas: growth, export competitiveness, poverty reduction, employment creation, health, education, agriculture, infrastructure (roads & energy), environment, devolution, Judicial reforms, governance and anti-corruption, public financial reforms and financial sector deepening. The policy notes were shared by policy makers and the core team preparing the Kenya's second Medium Term Plan 2013-2017.
6. Policy Dialogue and engagement: Through the Policy dialogue and engagement component of the knowledge programs I organize high level policy dialogue forums: The quarterly round tables are used as a forum to disseminate findings from the knowledge programs and engage top policy makers. The roundtables are held quarterly and draw participants from the Ministry of Finance, the Ministry of Planning, Central Bank, policy think tanks (e.g. KIPPRA), Economic and Social Council, Vision 2030, parliamentary committees, and other relevant stakeholders depending on the topic of discussion. The forums have been successful.

Program Manager for private sector development and tourism; EU Delegation Kenya:

1. **Tourism Recovery and Marketing:** Kenya's tourism collapsed after the negative publicity following the 2008 political violence. Tourism is a key foreign exchange earner, second after tea so Kenya's balance of payments situation deteriorated. Although the EU had a tourism programme, it was difficult to disburse after the political violence nevertheless working against all odds I led a team that formulated and implemented a tourism recovery plan with the Kenya Tourist Board and the Ministry of Tourism. The campaign aired documentaries on CNN, CNBC and the web, and conducted tourism promotions abroad. By 2009 tourism arrivals had recovered though still short of the 2007 levels.
2. **Strengthening local capacity in project Implementation:** One of the key achievements was the shift away from independent donor supported project implementation units (PIU) to mainstreaming EU support within existing local institutions and building their capacity to deliver on donor programs and become sustainable after donors exit. The Micro Enterprise Support Programme Trust (MESPT: www.mesptrust.org) is good example where we mainstreamed our micro finance program support, and consequently other donors came on board to support the whole sale lender.

Senior Policy Analyst Kenya Institute for Public Policy Research & Analysis

1. **Macroeconomic Modelling:** for forecasting and policy analysis: Aggregate demand model: KIPPRA Treasury Macro model: As a member of the KIPPRA macro modelling team we provided technical support to the Government through the KIPPRA/Treasury Macro Model in three key areas: provided short and medium term growth forecasts as a key input to the planning process. Closely related to the growth forecasts we used the model to provide a coherent fiscal framework for the budget (resource envelop) and alternative macroeconomic scenarios to the Macroeconomic working and Sector working groups during the budget process. We also used model simulations to evaluate various policy options for the Poverty Reductions Strategy (PRSP).
2. **Team leader growth study:** As task team leader of the growth study we constructed the 2003 Social Accounting Matrix for Kenya, constructed a CGE/micro simulation model for Kenya which we used to simulate alternative growth scenarios for Kenya and develop a strategy for rural investments in Kenya.

1. **Senior Economist Ministry of Finance:** responsible for the formulation of the aggregate fiscal framework including budget policy and expenditure framework, setting budget ceilings for ministries and departments, quarterly disbursement schedules and all matters relating to ministerial budgets.
2. **Regular expenditure monitoring and reporting;** responsible for quarterly expenditure monitoring and reporting including tracking the payment of pending bills. This work programme also covered the Public Expenditure Reviews (PERs) undertaken jointly with the World Bank.
