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CHAIRPERSON'S FOREWORD

Mombasa, Kwale and Kilifi Counties were among the first lock down counties at the onset of the COVID 19 Pandemic. The economies of these counties largely depend on both local and foreign tourism and hence were hard hit by the pandemic. As a response to this, the Government initiated several measures to shield the most vulnerable groups and especially the terminally ill, those who lost their jobs and businesses and the potentially vulnerable slum dwellers. Under the purview of the Committee, there are two programs namely:

1. The Covid 19 Response Emergency Fund as a complement to the National Safety Net Program, popularly known as Inua Jamii. It is important to note that this was not part of the regular cash transfer program, but an addition to the same. A total of Kshs. 10 billion was allocated for this purpose during the Second Supplementary Estimates, in April 2020. The program falls under the State Department for Social Protection but managed by a multi-Agency team with the State Department for Interior playing a key role.
2. The National Hygiene Program (Kazi Mtaani) was also initiated at the same time and targeted mostly urban youth in slum areas. This program is managed by the State Department for Housing and Urban Development under the Ministry of Transport, Housing, Infrastructure and Urban Development.


As part of its oversight role, the Committee resolved to visit select counties to monitor how the State Departments implemented the two programs. Specifically, the objectives of the visit were:

- i) to understand how the Government implemented the program, given the huge amounts of money involved;
- ii) to meet some of the beneficiaries to have a feel of the impact of the two programs on the citizens;
- iii) to meet representatives of civil society organizations, including religious leaders and Youth Organizations to ascertain the level of fairness and equity in the identification of beneficiaries;
- iv) to meet the officers involved in the process including the National Government Administrative Officers and line Ministry officers to understand the challenges involved and the successes attained.

Further, the Committee sought to know the amount of money allocated for the program at each of the counties; how the beneficiaries of each of the Programs were identified; the impact of the Program on the beneficiaries and sustainability of the two programs.

May I take this opportunity to express my gratitude to Committee Members for their resilience and devotion to duty which made the inspection visit successful. May I also appreciate the Offices of the Speaker and Clerk of National Assembly for always providing guidance, direction and facilitating the Committees in the discharge of their mandate. Finally, I commend the secretariat for exemplary performance in providing technical and logistical support to the Committee.

On behalf of the Departmental Committee on Labour and Social Welfare it is my pleasant duty to submit to the House a report on fact finding visit on Social Protection Measures put in place by the Government in combating Covid-19 Pandemic in Coastal Region.

PART 2

2.0 FACT FINDING VISIT ON SOCIAL PROTECTION MEASURES PUT IN PLACE BY THE GOVERNMENT IN COMBATING COVID-19 PANDEMIC IN COASTAL REGION

2.1 Background Information

5. The outbreak of Covid-19 occasioned the adoption of containment policies to limit the spread of the virus across the country. The socio-economic impact of these containment policies been particularly hard on low income earners who often rely on daily wages from casual work, by negatively impacting on their abilities to meet basic needs. The majority of these people reside and work in slums and informal settlements and constitute the urban poor. Additionally, the conditions in which these families eke their livelihoods is deplorable since service delivery in informal settlements is challenged at best.
6. In response of these undesirable consequences, the National Hygiene Program (NHP) hailed as *kazi mtaani* initiative and the upscaling of the cash transfer program with additional kshs.10 billion as a response towards the cushioning of the elderly and other vulnerable groups were conceptualized.

2.2 National Hygiene Program (NHP)

7. The program is an extended public works project (EPWPs) aimed at utilizing labor intensive approaches to create sustainable public goods in the urban development sector. Through this initiative, residents from informal settlements were recruited to undertake projects concentrated in and around informal settlements with the aim of improving their environment, service delivery infrastructure, and providing income generation opportunities. Using existing or redirected funding for urban infrastructure development in the informal settlements, this Daily-wages-for-Work (cash for work) program supports widespread employment of workers recruited.
8. The first phase of the NHP program focused on informal settlements in eight counties where containment strategies had disrupted local economic activities, making it difficult for those reliant on daily work to meet their basic needs. The phase II covered all the remaining counties and commenced on 6th July, 2020.
9. The NHP phase I covered Mombasa, Kilifi, Kwale, Kiambu, Nairobi, Nakuru, Mandera and Kisumu which were chosen on the basis of reporting the first incidence of covid-19 cases and were subject to containment measures where a total of 31448 youths were recruited.
10. The youths who signed up for work are paid on a weekly basis. The payment modalities for the program are such that the youth are paid at least once a week through mobile money transfers in line with the government's directive of deepening mobile usage so as to reduce the risk of spreading covid-19 through physical of cash. For this purpose, the youth were sensitized on the need to have active telephone numbers that are registered to them individually.
11. However, we note that there was some occurrence of non-payments in certain weeks due to the following reasons:

- i. Some youth provided telephone numbers that were not registered with MPESA and therefore Safaricom could not successfully remit. This was however addressed by encouraging youths to register.
 - ii. Some youths provided telephone numbers that do not match with their IDs resulting to mismatched details. This was especially the case when the youth used IDs that belong to other family members.
 - iii. Some youths had blocked or frozen numbers due to having taken FULIZA loan from Safaricom. The county implementation committees with the assistance of supervisors varied and cleaned up the data so that no youth is unpaid.
12. The Ministry together with the National Steering Committee (NSC) developed strategies for the rolling over phase of Phase II and III. Where an operational manual, recruitment and selection criteria were developed. The Ministry also engaged counties and municipal managers in selection of counties and also worked with *nyumba kumi*, National Government Officers (NGAO), National Youth Service (NYS), State Department for Youth and Council of Governors to make sure the roll out phase II and III was all inclusive and eliminated the challenges of phase I.
13. The following measures were put in place:
 - i. Piloting the roll out registration system which with the capability of capturing workers' details during the registration process and also routinely during the check-in check-outs. To effect this, all the workers were issued with a card with a QR code for purposed of monitoring their attendance and also speeding up the payment processes while also improving the detection of errors in the workers list.
 - ii. Engaging supervisors from key government institutions such as NYS to manage the workflow at the county level.
 - iii. A mechanism to train the youth and supervisors so that the challenges are minimized were put in place.
 - iv. Other activities that were not in Phase I such as the construction of cobble stone access roads, construction of storm water drainages, maintenance of schools and construction of markets among others were included in the program.
14. The criteria employed to identify beneficiaries was to ensure fairness and equitability by targeting the most vulnerable in the community and this includes:
 - i. The selection was undertaken through a committee of *Nyumba Kumi*, National Government Administrative Officers (NGAO), settlement executive committee and County Social Workers so as to promote transparency and equity.
 - ii. The youth were chosen from a settlement where they reside and also where the work is being undertaken. This was to reduce conflicts among residents and also encourage community participation.

2.3 Upscaling of Cash Transfer Program

15. His Excellency the president directed on the 16th of April 2020 the government to establish a mechanism for cushioning vulnerable Kenyans whose focus would be on the need to provide basic needs and a means to recover and rebuild after the crisis and also reduce movement due to income loss that would lead to the spread of the virus.
16. Following the provision of the kshs.10 billion under the Covid-19 as a response towards the cushioning of the elderly and other vulnerable groups, the multi agencies (Labor and

Social Protection, Interior and Citizen Services and Health) involved in the covid-19 managed to undertake a pilot in the informal settlements of Nairobi, Mombasa, Kilifi, and Kwale.

17. The Ministry of Labour and Social Protection working through a multi-agency approach involving Ministries of Interior, Health, Labor and Social Protection identified the vulnerable groups where the focus was on those vulnerable persons not benefiting from other existing government welfare benefits both in the urban and rural areas and shall not be limited to the current age sets or categorical vulnerabilities.
18. A multi-agency steering committee was set up at the Sub-location, Sub-County and County levels with representations of all key departments and entrusted with validation of potential beneficiaries identified through grass root “nyumba kumi” clusters.
19. Priority was given to: -
 - a) Households with a high poverty index and where the bread winner is disabled;
 - b) Households with a high poverty index and where the breadwinner is widowed;
 - c) Households with high poverty index and where the bread head is a minor.
 - d) Households with high poverty index and where the head is suffering from pre-existing medical condition;
 - e) Households with high poverty index and where the head is mentally vulnerable;
 - f) Households not benefitting from other government support programmes; and
 - g) Households selected from urban-informal settlements that were hard hit.
20. These data were then processed through available information held by the government and weekly stipend of kshs1,000 was paid to every enrolled household starting 15th April 2020.
21. Mobile money transfer through Safaricom was identified as the most appropriate due to the financial landscape in the country as it is widely used. Conditions were agreed upon with the service provider to protect the beneficiaries including protection of the stipend from other financial obligations by the beneficiaries with the provider and an edict that the funds were “From the Government of Kenya” to the normal Mpesa message.
22. Over 108,000 households were identified in the four counties. Results from this strategy was instrumental in informing the approach to use in up-scaling to the rest of the country.
23. One Hundred and Thirty-Eight Thousand (138,000) beneficiaries who were in the exemption list were given first priority in receiving this one-off payment.
24. For Mombasa, Kwale and Kilifi the total beneficiary households are 34,049, 30,703 and 14,752 respectively with total disbursements of Kshs.673,963,000, Kshs.675,466,000 and Kshs.324,544,000 respectively.

3.0 MEETING WITH BENEFICIARIES IN THE COASTAL REGION

3.1 MOMBASA COUNTY

25. Phase I of the program started in April 2020 and progressed simultaneously in eight selected counties including Mombasa. Phase II was launched by H.E President Uhuru Kenyatta on July 2nd 2020 to cover a period of six months from July 13th 2020.
26. The program is labour intensive and it created 16,789 casual jobs to the youths and vulnerable groups within the 56 informal settlements in Mombasa County. The second Phase has several activities focusing on five main activities which include: Street cleaning services; fumigation and disinfection services; garbage collection; bush cleaning; drainage unclogging and cleaning.
27. Cohort A had 8338 workers, Cohort B 7456 workers and Cohort C which is a pending list has 965 workers with estimated funds of Kshs. 225,384,985.
28. The implementation and coordination team for Mombasa county includes the County Commissioner as the Chair, County director for housing as the Secretary, County director of youth, KURA, KERRA, NYS, forest department, County government- departments of health and environment and KNA for media coverage. The regional coordinator is the overall coordinator of the NHP in all six Coast counties.

3.2. KWALE COUNTY

29. Kwale County was among the first beneficiaries of the covid-19 Cash transfer program. The county managed to enrol 67,940 vulnerable persons for its four sub counties with 15,539 from Msambweni, 34,816 from Kinango, 9,242 from Matuga and 8,343 from Lunga Lunga.
30. The programme started in the last week of March 2020 where each beneficiary was to receive a total of Kshs.24,000 in instalments of Kshs.1,000 per week. The cash transfer was being done directly from headquarters to beneficiaries' accounts and most of them reported receipt of the cash.
31. The National Hygiene programme (NHP) in Kwale county is progressing well which can be attributed to the piloting phase in which during the first phase, the programme had employed 1000 youths in Whitehouse and Karanja informal settlements in Msambweni and Matuga sub counties respectively and despite the challenges, phase 1 was successful.
32. In the second phase a total of 3488 workers and 116 supervisors were recruited across the four sub counties of Matuga, Kinango, Msambweni and Lunga Lunga. The workers were split into two cohorts; cohort 1 with 1778 workers and cohort 2 with 1710 workers though 50 workers left the programme and were not replaced.
33. With the third round of phase 2 cohorts in progress and as we progress, they intend to identify and work on projects with a long-lasting impact. The projects include:
 - a) Use of interlocking soil stabilized blocks to construct public toilets, classrooms, boundary walls among others;
 - b) Landscaping of public institutions;

- c) Opening of new roads; and
- d) Laying of cobblestones on unpaved roads.

34. Approximately kshs.60,000,000 has been disbursed to Kwale County since the start of the programme. A total of kshs.24,000,000 was disbursed during the first phase with a total of 1000 workers who worked for 40 days and being paid Kshs.600 daily. For the second phase, a total of 3488 workers and 116 supervisors being paid ksh.455 and kshs.505 respectively on a daily basis and so far, an approximate amount of kshs.35,000,000 have been disbursed.

3.3 KILIFI COUNTY

35. Kilifi county was among the 8 counties selected for piloting of the National Hygiene Program also commonly known as Kazi Mtaani. The County was allocated 1000 slots shared equally between Jakaba informal settlement in Mariakani- Kaloleni Sub county and KKB informal settlement in Bahari- Kilifi North Sub county.

36. Recruitment was done through Interior department of infrastructure. Wages for phase one were set at 600/= per day and supervision was done through Nyumba Kumi elders. Phase two was rolled out on in July, 2020 after a similar recruitment process retaining those who were in phase one and wished to continue.

37. There were changes in the wages and period of work for each youth which was to make it possible to engage more workers after an outcry country wide. The allocated slots for the County was 6,648 workers and 221 supervisors distributed in six Sub counties of Kilifi North, Kilifi South, Rabai, Kaloleni, Malindi and Magarini. The initial target areas to benefit was still maintained with additions of more informal registered settlements added on.

38. The Government has so far expended Kshs. 66,546,480 for workers and Kshs. 4,910,100 for supervisors in Kilifi County.

39. Garbage collection was done in all the identified informal settlements and the Kilifi County Government provided garbage collection trucks for disposal. The County Government also provided wheelbarrows, spades and watering jars to be used during implementation of the Legacy Projects.

40. The weekly Cash Stipend Programme to vulnerable households in Kilifi benefitted 14,752 households. A total of Kshs.324,544,000 was disbursed to the County.

4.0 ACHIEVEMENTS AND CHALLENGES

4.1 ACHIEVEMENTS

41. Youth have benefitted with the creation of thousands of casual employment opportunities
42. Fumigation, Street cleaning, bush clearing, Garbage collection and drainage unlogging has been done both in towns and informal settlements.
43. Cushioning the youth and families against negative covid-19 economic impacts, Crime reduction, reduction in drug abuse cases, decrease in cases of domestic violence, clean living environment, increase in disposable income for the workers, safe access paths and tree planting were some of the noted achievements.
44. The program launched training for the youth in entrepreneurship skills with the State Department of Housing & Urban Development and the Youth department taking a lead role.

4.2 CHALLENGES

45. Targeting was done in haste hence it was hard to get exact number of beneficiaries paid and not paid.
46. There is Lack of proper monitoring and evaluation tools, poor network coverage in rural areas and inadequate facilitation of airtime especially for supervisors.
47. Lack of Personal Protective Equipment and inadequate working tools like garbage collection bags, bins and trucks for transportation.
48. Delayed payments, slow processing of payment claims for unpaid workers and unreliable app for clocking in and out workers
49. Lack of transport for the Ministry's level supervision team, low staffing level at the Counties and inadequate and obsolete IT equipment to process information.

PART 3

5.0 COMMITTEE'S OBSERVATIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

5.1 Committee's Observation

1. Since the commencement of National Hygiene Programme, sanitation and environment hazards in settlements have been reduced drastically. This has been witnessed by reduction of garbage and bushes in these areas and clean streets and drainage systems.
2. The National Hygiene Program lacks a clear tool of Monitoring and Evaluation, hence difficult to evaluate in terms of specific achievements.
3. Concerns were raised, especially in Mombasa County of collusion between supervisors and youth engaged in the *Kazi Mtaani* Program to defraud the Government by ‘clocking in’ but not doing the actual chores for which they were paid.
4. Both Programs are biased towards urban dwellers, yet with loss of jobs due to the pandemic, thousands of Kenyans flocked to their rural homes. With high incidences of poverty prevalent in the country, these urban- rural migrations aggravated the situation.
5. There is no mechanism for tracking payments at the County level especially for the COVID-Emergency Fund since payments are made directly to the beneficiaries by Safaricom with no returns to the County level officials who prepared the lists of payees. Therefore, they are not able to track those paid and those not paid from the lists they submit.
6. The National Hygiene Program does not have data on beneficiaries per Constituency. This makes it difficult to monitor given the central role of the Constituency in allocation of resources.
7. While attempts have been made to involve key stakeholders in the process of identification of beneficiaries for both programs, there is need for wider consultation including among religious leaders, civil society groups and local political leadership in the selection of beneficiaries to ensure the highest possible degree of fairness and equity.
8. There is a possibility of some beneficiaries placing all their hopes on the two programs, yet the two were meant to be one- off emergency measures to shield the vulnerable against adverse effects of COVID. This could lead to a dependency syndrome that can spiral out of hand.
9. The youth involved in the National Hygiene Program were not provided with adequate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) thus exposing them to the risk of contracting the COVID-19 virus. Similarly, given the kind of work such as clearing bushes and drainages the right occupational gears such as aprons and gumboots were not availed.
10. The COVID-Emergency Fund, could have locked out thousands of very poor Kenyans who reside in areas with limited or no Safaricom network and those without phone numbers since payments were made through individual phone numbers.

11. The State Department of Youth Affairs, through the Directorate of Youth has initiated a training Program aimed at enhancing the entrepreneurship skills of youth especially those under the National Hygiene Program. This is a positive effort towards breaking the possible dependency syndrome on this Program
12. There have been marked reduction in crime and drug abuse in the three counties since the introduction of the *Kazi Mtaani* Program.
13. Inadequate facilitation at the grassroots level in terms of transport and office equipment. It was reported in Kilifi that the State Department for Housing which is over seeing the *Kazi Mtaani* Program, does not have a single vehicle for mobility. Similarly, Chiefs, who are pivotal in the *Nyumba Kumi* set up lack even basic office equipment such as computers and printers.

5.2 Committee Recommendations

The Committee recommends as follows-

1. Identification of beneficiaries be done in a more open way with all stakeholders fully involved. These Stakeholders should include religious and civil society groups, community leaders at all levels and political leaders. The lists of beneficiaries should as much as possible reflect the diversity of the local population and take into consideration gender, disability and minority groups.
2. An objective tool for monitoring and evaluation be developed for tracking the National Hygiene Program to ensure the beneficiaries are paid based on a clearly set criteria that is fair and uniform to all.
3. People who migrated to rural areas after losing their sources of livelihoods due to the Pandemic be included into the National Hygiene Program (*Kazi Mtaani*).
4. The State Departments for Social Protection and Interior and Coordination should in conjunction with Safaricom, avail the list of beneficiaries paid in each County to the County Commissioners for ease of tracking payments and verifying recipients. This should be done every week immediately after the payments are made.
5. The State Department for Housing and Urban Development should disaggregate data on beneficiaries of the *Kazi Mtaani* Program, per constituency and avail the same to the National Assembly.
6. The State Departments for Social Protection, Interior and Coordination and Youth Affairs should initiate awareness creation efforts on the objectives of these programs and their transitional nature to safeguard the youth and other beneficiaries from falling into a dependency mindset. Country wide sensitization should be conducted to educate people on other more permanent initiatives such as the Youth Fund, Women Fund and *Uwezo* Fund. They should also be sensitized on training opportunities offered by the National Industrial Training Authority (NITA) and other Government sponsored institutions.
7. The State Department for Housing and Urban Development should prioritize the provision of PPEs to the beneficiaries under *Kazi Mtaani*. The State Department should also provide suitable gear to the participants in line with the nature of work as required by the Occupational Safety and Health Act, 2017
8. The State Departments for Social Protection and Housing and Urban Development, should work out modalities of ensuring that poor Kenyans who do not have mobile phone hand sets and those in areas with no network connectivity do not lose out on Government schemes to cushion the poor.
9. The Government, through relevant State Departments should consider the conversion of relief food to cash stipends to enhance its effectiveness and to accord beneficiaries the flexibility to buy food of their preference.
10. The State Department for Youth Affairs should upscale the entrepreneurial training it has initiated for the beneficiaries of *Kazi Mtaani* Program and bring onboard the various

affirmative funds to help in transitioning the beneficiaries of the COVID-19 emergency Fund and *Kazi Mtaani* into other more sustainable initiatives.

11. For both Programs, the relevant State Departments should provide the officers at the grassroots level with adequate facilitation to enhance efficiency and effectiveness. These equipment include motor vehicles, Computers, laptops, printers and communication infrastructure.
12. That the two Programs be extended to support the vulnerable until the economy opens up fully given that the adverse effects of COVID 19 will be felt for a long time.

The meeting was called to order at 2.45pm and thereafter a prayer was said. The Chairperson informed Members that the main agenda of the afternoon Sitting was adoption of the report on Petition by PCK workers and a report on Fact Finding Visit to coastal region to assess social protection measures during Covid-19 pandemic.

MIN.NO. DC/LSW/206/2020: - ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

The program of the retreat was adopted with the following changes having been proposed and seconded by the Hon. Caleb Amisi, MP and the Hon. Abdi Mude Ibrahim, MP respectively: -

MIN.NO. DC/LSW/207/2020: CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS SITTING

Confirmation of the Minutes of the previous sitting was deferred to the next sitting.

MIN.NO. DC/LSW/208/2020: REPORT ON THE CONSIDERATION OF THE PETITION REGARDING THE PAYMENT OF SALARY ARREARS FOR STAFF OF THE POSTAL CORPORATION OF KENYA

The Committee went through the report and adopted it with the following observations and recommendations: -

Observations

The Committee made the following observations from the submissions-

- i). The Postal Corporation of Kenya has had decreasing revenue generation ability since 2015 leading to a delay in meeting its financial obligations including delaying payment of staff salaries since March of 2020;
- ii). The 2017 Report on the Task Force on Revitalization of PCK, which among others recommended the restructuring of PCK to enable it focus on key business lines and carrying out a staff rationalization program, had not been implemented;
- iii). The Ministry had to request the National Treasury to inject funds to the Postal Corporation of Kenya as a short-term measure to salvage the cash crisis;
- iv). The National Treasury approved Kshs 810 million for transfers to PCK vide a letter Ref. No. TNT/ZZ/331/03'TY' of 1st September 2020;
- v). Upon receipt of the exchequer, the Ministry of ICT, Innovation and Youth Affairs remitted the funds to Postal Corporation of Kenya (PCK) and thereafter the Ministry had been informed that all the employees had since been paid their salary arrears;
- vi). It was only after the Petitioners made prayers to the National Assembly that the issue was resolved.

Recommendations

1. The Committee recommended as follows-

- i). That the Ministry of ICT, Innovation and Youth Affairs should ensure that concrete efforts are made to ensure that the Corporation always pays its staff salaries on time and come up with a sustainable manner of funding its operations;
- ii). That the 2017 report on the Task Force on Revitalization of PCK, which among others recommended the restructuring of PCK to enable it focus on key business lines and carrying out a staff rationalization program should be implemented;
- iii). The Ministry of ICT, Innovation and Youth Affairs should initiate a process aimed at conclusively resolving the financial crisis at the Postal Corporation of Kenya;
- iv). The Postal Corporation of Kenya should initiate measures, including upgrading of its technology to compete effectively and innovatively in order to adequately meet its financial obligations in a timely manner.

MIN.NO. DC/LSW/209/2020: REPORT ON SOCIAL PROTECTION MEASURES IN COASTAL REGION DURING COVID-19 PANDEMIC.

The Committee deliberated on the report and made the following observations and recommendations: -

Observations

1. Since the commencement of National Hygiene Programme, sanitation and environment hazards in settlements have been reduced drastically. This has been witnessed by reduction of garbage and bushes in these areas and clean streets and drainage systems.
2. The National Hygiene Program lacks a clear tool of Monitoring and Evaluation, hence difficult to evaluate in terms of specific achievements
3. Concerns were raised, especially in Mombasa County of collusion between supervisors and youth engaged in the Kazi Mtaani Program to defraud the Government by '*clocking in*' but not doing the actual chores for which they are paid.
4. Both Programs are biased towards urban dwellers, yet with loss of jobs due to the pandemic, thousands of Kenyans flocked to their rural homes.
5. There is no mechanism for tracking payments at the County level especially for the COVID-Emergency Fund since payments are made directly to the beneficiaries by Safaricom with no returns to the county level officials who prepared the lists of payees.
6. The National Hygiene Program does not have data on beneficiaries per Constituency. This makes it difficult to monitor given the central role of the Constituency in allocation of resources.
7. While attempts have been made to involve key stakeholders in the process of identification of beneficiaries for both programs, there is need for wider consultation including among religious leaders, civil society groups and local political leadership in the selection of beneficiaries to ensure the highest possible degree of fairness and equity.
8. There is a possibility of some beneficiaries placing all their hopes on the two programs, yet the two were meant to be one- off emergency measures to shield the vulnerable against adverse effects of COVID. This could lead to a dependency syndrome that can spiral out of hand.

9. The youth involved in the National Hygiene Program were not provided with adequate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) thus exposing to the risk of contacting the COVID-19 virus. Similarly, given the kind of work such as clearing bushes and drainages the right occupational gears such as aprons and gumboots were not availed
10. The COVID-Emergency Fund, could have locked out thousands of very poor Kenyans who reside in areas with limited or no Safaricom network and those without phone numbers since payments were made through individual phone numbers.
11. The State Department of Youth Affairs, through the Directorate of Youth has initiated a training Program aimed at enhancing the entrepreneurship skills of youth especially those under the National Hygiene Program.
12. There have been marked reduction in crime and drug abuse in the three counties since the introduction of the Kazi Mtaani Program.
13. Inadequate facilitation at the grassroot level in terms of transport and office equipment.

Recommendations

The Committee recommended as follows-

1. Identification of beneficiaries be done in a more open way with all stakeholders fully involved.
2. An objective tool for monitoring and evaluation be developed for tracking the National Hygiene Program to ensure the beneficiaries are paid based on a clearly set criteria that is fair and uniform to all.
3. That people who migrated to rural areas after losing their sources of livelihoods due to the Pandemic be included into the National Hygiene Program (Kazi Mtaani)
4. The State Departments for Social Protection and Interior and Coordination should in conjunction with Safaricom, avail the list of beneficiaries paid in each county to the County Commissioners for ease of tracking payments and verifying recipients.
5. The State Department for Housing and Urban Development should disaggregate data on beneficiaries of the Kazi Mtaani Program, per constituency and avail the same to the National Assembly.
6. The State Departments for Social Protection, Interior and Coordination and Youth Affairs should initiate awareness creation efforts on the objectives of these programs and their transitional nature to safeguard the youth and other beneficiaries from falling into a dependency mindset.
7. The State Department for Housing and Urban Development should prioritize the provision of PPEs to the beneficiaries under Kazi Mtaani. The State Department should also provide suitable gear to the participants in line with the nature of work as required by the Occupational Safety and Health Act, 2017.
8. The State Departments for Social Protection and Housing and Urban Development, should work out modalities of ensuring that poor Kenyans who do not have mobile phone hand sets and those in areas with no network connectivity do not lose out on Government schemes to cushion the poor.
9. The State Department for Youth Affairs should upscale the entrepreneurial training it has initiated for the beneficiaries of Kazi Mtaani Program and bring onboard the various affirmative funds to help in transitioning the beneficiaries of the COVID-19 emergency Fund and Kazi Mtaani into other more sustainable initiatives.

10. For both Programs, the relevant State Departments should provide the officers at the grassroots level with adequate facilitation to enhance efficiency and effectiveness.
11. That the two Programs be extended to support the vulnerable until the economy opens up fully given that the adverse effects of COVID 19 will be felt for a long time.



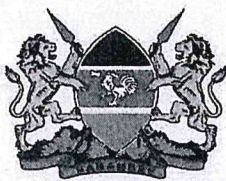

Background

The outbreak of COVID-19 occasioned the adoption of containment policies to limit the spread of the virus across the country. The socio-economic impact of these containment policies has been particularly hard on low-income earners who often rely on daily wages from casual work, by negatively impacting on their ability to meet their basic needs. The majority of these people reside and work in slums and informal settlements and constitute the urban poor. Additionally, the conditions in which these families eke out their livelihoods is deplorable because service delivery in informal settlements is challenged at best.

In response to these undesirable consequences, the National Hygiene Program (NHP), hailed as the *Kazi Mtaani* initiative, was conceptualized. The program is an extended public works project (EPWPs) aimed at utilizing labour-intensive approaches to create sustainable public goods in the urban development sector. Through this initiative, residents from informal settlements were recruited to undertake projects concentrated in and around informal settlements to improve their environment, service delivery infrastructure, and to provide income generation opportunities. Using existing or redirected funding for urban infrastructure development in the informal settlements, this Daily-Wages-for-Work (cash for work) program supports employment of the workers recruited.

Question 086/2020

- 1. What plans has the Ministry put in place to ensure that jobless youths in all counties other than those in slums and urban areas benefit from the National Hygiene Initiative dubbed “Kazi Mtaani” especially in the programmes and projects for the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic?***

Mr. Chairman,

I submit my response as follows:

The Ministry recognizes that the negative economic impacts of COVID-19 have not only been restricted to slums and urban areas, and continue to be experienced in all regions of the country. As a result, we have witnessed an increase in poverty levels due to low levels of economic activity which have affected local incomes and livelihood.

Kazi Mtaani, being a social protection programme, places a premium on achieving the highest socio-economic impact. The approach taken by my Ministry was guided by the

relative vulnerability of the youth across the country. We have witnessed the highest incidences of inequality and urban poverty in urban areas. *Kazi Mtaani* has, therefore, focused on areas so as to achieve the highest possible socio-economic impact.

My Ministry can confirm that all counties across the country have benefitted from the rollout of NHP Phase II. Areas not necessarily urban, slums or informal settlements have also been factored in, based on their unique attributes.

Our decision to lower the wages paid per worker to KShs 455.00 from the labour approved wage rate will ensure that the money put at the disposal of the *Kazi Mtaani* programme reaches more youths across the country. As a result of this and other decisions, the number of youths engaged in the programme has increased from 31,689 to 282,617 workers.

Question 102/2020

2. Could the Cabinet Secretary provide a report regarding the programme of implementation of the Kazi Mtaani initiative by the National Government, indicating the Constituencies where the initiative has been rolled out and total number of youths who have been engaged under the initiative in each constituency?

Mr. Chairman,

I submit my response as follows:

The *Kazi Mtaani* initiative was conceptualized and designed to be implemented in two (2) phases. The first phase, which commenced on the 29th April 2020 was completed on 26th June 2020. This phase covered eight (8) counties and benefited a total of 31,689 vulnerable youths living in slums and informal settlements. The counties involved in this phase included: Kilifi, Kwale, Mombasa, Nairobi, Kiambu, Nakuru, Kisumu and Mandera.

The following tabular report presents the distribution of the workers by county during the first phase:-

Whereas the first phase of the programme targeted 31,689 workers in a few counties, the second phase is being rolled-out to all 47 counties and shall engage 282,617 workers, including vulnerable youth living in slums and informal areas in our urban areas, for a duration of six and a half months.

My Ministry has rolled-out the second phase of the programme, which will employ work scheduling. The workers have been divided into two (2) cohorts and shall be engaged to work in 11-day shifts.

Annexed to this response, is a tabular report on the distribution of workers per county in the second phase of the programme.

Question 102/2020

- 3. Could the Cabinet Secretary explain why some constituencies including West Mugirango Constituency have not benefited under the initiative?**

Mr. Chairman,

I submit my response as follows:

The first phase of the programme was a pilot that primarily focused on the first hit counties that suffered economically due to the enforcement of COVID-19 containment measures. These measures were expected to increase the vulnerability of the poorest residents of urban areas.

West Mugirango Constituency, not being one of the areas targeted by the movement restrictions, did not qualify for inclusion in phase one. However, this constituency is set to benefit in the second phase of the *Kazi Mtaani* programme.

Since the target of the programme is vulnerable urban youth living in slums and informal settlements, the *Kazi Mtaani* initiative shall focus mainly on urban areas. As

such, all urban areas have undergone a mapping exercise to determine the number of informal areas vis a vis the total urban population, which will inform the rollout of the second phase.

In West Mugirango Constituency, informal settlements that satisfy the above criteria have been identified in the following Wards; Township, Bosamaro, Bonyamatuta, Bogichora and Nyamaiya (*See annexed report*). Vulnerable youths residing in informal settlements located in these Wards are set to benefit from the *Kazi Mtaani* programme.
